MINUTES OF APRIL MEETING

The regular meeting of the Old Dobbs County Genealogical Society was held April 12, 1987 at 3:00pm in the Auditorium of the Wayne County Public Library. President Elliott Futrell presided.

Frances Andrews read a letter from the National Genealogical Conference Committee regarding registration. Attendees will be allowed to register for one day only for \$25.00. The conference runs from 13-16 May. The Committee needs assistance from volunteers to help with registration for 2 hour increments and also to help man exhibits. Frances also mentioned quacks who are sending out falso genealogical information, one Elizabeth (middle name changes to suit vendor) Ross who is not the same Elizabeth Ross who signed the letter from the National Conference Committee.

A motion was made by Kathleen Wilson and withdrawn to donate \$100 each to Carolyn Griffin (from the Wayne Co. Library) and Mary Spiron (Wayne Community. College) to help defray expenses while attending the conference. Another motion was made by Frances Andrews to contribute \$50 each to those two individuals for the same purpose. The change in amount was due to scarcity of money in the Treasury because of outstanding obligations. The motion was seconded by Fannie Widener and carried.

Elliott Futrell has recommended the society meet quarterly on a Saturday. This recommended change will be taken before the annual meeting for consideration.

The humble petition of Faithy Smith Widow

Sheweth

that your petitioners late Husband John Smith on or about the first Day of April last Inlisted in the Dobbs Detachment And Marched with the Army in the late expedition against the Insurgents and in the Battel at the Alamance received a Mortal wound of which he on the next day after the said Battel died leaving your petitioner a very poor and distressed Widdow with an Infant at her Breast and no kind of Support except the pay of her Deceased husband allowed by his Commanding Officer to the Time of his Death only which is now exhaused, your petitioner in a Low weakly Condition is likely to become chargable to the Parish

Therefore humbly pray such Assistance and relief in the premises as this Honble House shall think meet

To the General Assembly of the State of No Carolina

The Petition of Thomas Saint who is one of the People Called Quakers Sheweth that sometime in the Year 1771 He purchased of one Arthur Bryant who had Purchased at the Sale of the State of John Weaver formerly Sheriff of Dobbs County a Tract of Land Containing Seven hundred acres which your Petitioner has Since been informed the said John Weaver had entered in the Earl of Granville office and had the Same Surveyed, but did not obtain a Deed for the same, oweing as Your Petitioner is informed, to the said Earls office being Shut up, that your Petitioner Received this information in time for him to have applyed to the entry Takers office to have Re-entered the said Landwhich he would willingly have done, but he was also informed that he must Previous to his being allowed to make such Entry make a Particular Declaration of Fedility to the State, as Directed by act of assembly, this Declaration after due Consideration He cannot, consistant with the Dictates of his Conscience Subscribe to, of which he has made no Scruple to make his Neighbours acquainted with and Some of them being avariciously inclined have entered and one Benjamin Sharrard has actually Surveyed a part of your Petitioners Land purchased as aforesaid, your Petitioner Confideing in the Justice of the General Assembly and assuring them that he is Ready to give any Test of his Supporting the State as a Subject, which he can Consistant with his Principles. Hopes that you will be pleased to direct the Grant to the aforesaid Benjamin Sharrard for so much of his Survey as he has made within your said Fetitioners line to be Stayed and not issued and that your Petitioners may be allowed to enter and obtain a Grant for his said purchase

and He will pray for the wellfare of the State

From: General Assembly Session Records; Januarya February 1779 fo the General Assembly of the State of North Carolina now seting

The Petition of Sundry inhabetents in Wayne and Edgecombe Counties, whose names are here unto subscribed, humbly showeth that whereas they are informed that James Broadstreet late from the State of Georgia, is charged with killing a certain Benjamin Vickers, in the said Georgia State Some Time in the month of October last past, and we your humble petitioners being well acquainted with the said James Broadstreet, for these Fifteen years last past (except one year) in which he went to Georgia, all which Time he the said James, conducted himself a peacible orderly person, and generally maintained a fair honest character---and also being well acquainted with the said Benjaman Vickers, (until he removed to the state of Georgia) who generally was known to maintain one of the worst of characters a person Generally making free of what belonged to other persons, and a man of a very malicious disposition, often invaiding his neighbors Goods, which character we are well informed he also maintained while in the State of Georgia--we your petitioners humbly conceive that if the said (James) did kill the said (Benjamin) he had great provication we therefore humbly pray that your honourable body will take said accusation into consideration, and pass an act of demnification for the said James Broadstreets conduct in the particular--and we your petitioners as in duty bound will ever pray--
