DIED, In Goldsboro', N.C., on the morning of the 20th inst., WILLIAM BENDER, infant son of Dr. Windal T. and Fannie Robinson, aged five months and nine days.

TRIBUTE TO THE MEMORY OF JOHN B. GRISWOLD. The 'Silent Reaper' has again visited our community and plucked from the bosom of a devoted and affectionate family one of the best of men. It is with no feelings of ordinary sorrow that we announce the death of JOHN B. GRISWOLD, Esq., which took place at his residence in this town on Wednesday morning last. For many years he was a member of Wayne Lodge of Masons... with a gifted family around him looking with that reverence and love due to a kind and loving husband and father, in the meridian of life, was summoned on the morning of the 21 st of July, 1869 , from his career of usefulness on earth... The mortal remains of brother Griswold were taken to St. Stephen's Church, from whence his funeral took place on Thursday morning, and were followed to the "city of the dead" by the members of Masonic Order, and a long procession of sorrowing relatives and friends.

Mr. Charles Ellis, brief overview of Wayne County History
Many of the members of the Peacock Family Association of the South are descended from Samuel Peacock (born about 1671) and Mary. They migrated down from Virginia into North Carolina. Some of their descendants have continued to live in North Carolina while others have scattered to all parts of the U.S.A. and world. The Association is holding their reunion in Wayne County, NC this year as this was home to many of their early ancestors. Samuel Peacock built a bridge at his own expense over the Great Contentney Creek. In 1751 Governor Gabriel Johnston of North Carolina signed a law allowing him and his heirs to collect tolls for crossing this bridge. It cost four pence for every man and horse, and one shilling for every carriage drawn by one or two horses or oxen, etc. A modern bridge is at that location now and is called the Peacock Bridge with an appropriate historical marker.
