Carol Peele told us that for some reason most of the Wayne County books have been stolen from the Archives.



Our meeting ended at 3:40pm.




Dammie, wite of B.T. OUTLAND Died April 26, 1889 Aged 54 years, 8 mos. & 8 days

NC in 1756/57 the same Garret & Margaret MC KINNE of Cecil Co. MD? Did Garret's son John MC KINNE m. Elizabeth POPE, possible dau. of Samuel & Sarah POPE of Craven, Co. NC in Dobbs Co. NC in 1770? Allied names are JONES, BLACKLEDGE, HOLLINGSWORTH, KILPATRICK. John & Elizabeth KC KINNE and their 9 children left Dobbs Co., NC in 1788 and migrated to Augusta, GA. Need information for family of James PERISHO III who married Sarah ?. James d. 1743 and Sarah d. 1760. Both deaths Perquimans Co. NC. Need marriages of children: Simon, James, Mornen. Dau. Jane m. Moses BUNDY and dau. Sarah m. Edmund MODLIN/MAUDLIN. Both moved to Wayne Co., NC.

Who was wife of William WORRELL? Who were parents of John DUNN? William Worrell was father of Edea, wife of John DUNN. Trying to find a connection to the Edmund MAUDLIN family. John DUNN owed note to estate of Edmund MODLIN/MAUDLIN family in 1806 and owed note to estate of Sarah MODLIN/MAUDLIN in 1817. Neither MODLIN/MAUDLIN had loaned money to others. Was John DUNN a relative?

THIS AND THAT

In the <u>Manuscript News</u>, the newsletter of the East Carolina Manuscript Collection, was the following item:

"WILLIAM F. AND CORA SUTTON BIBLE RECORDS. Bible records of LaGrange, N.C., family. 3 pages, copies. Gift of Mr. Roland C. Fields, Jr., Arlington, Virginia."

The East Carolina Manuscript Collection is located in J. Y. Joyner Library, East Carolina University.

In the Jan.-Feb. NGS Newsletter was an article on "Elizabeth Ross" a publisher of "family albums". She now assumes, as her maiden name, the name of the family to whom she is attempting to sell her books. She also no longer seems to be associated with American Genealogies Inc.. She now gives her address as Genealogy Room, P.O. Box 5300, Scranton, PA 18505-5300. The latest flagrant example of false advertising has been brought to the attention of the Consumer Protection Division of the U.S. Postal Service. In order to persue the matter the Postal Service needs to know of people who have ordered one of these books thinking it was compiled by a family member. If you know of people who have ordered these books please write or have them write to the NGS Newsletter Editor, 4527 17th St., N., Arlington, VA 22207.

Also, in the same Newsletter was an article on World War I Draft Records. In the Atlanta Branch of the National Archives are records from the World War I draft system. "The Branch currently holds some 24 million draft registration cards, filled out in 1917 and 1918 throughout the U.S. by men born between 1873 and 1900, whether they were accually drafted or not. Each card provides information on the registrant's birthdate and birthplace, citizenship, race, address,

occupation/employer, and name of person to be notified.

To locate a registration card a researcher must be able to identify the registrant, usually by full name and probable birthdate, and specify his residence in 1917 and 1918 (for rural areas they county name is sufficient, for metropolitan residents a street address is necessary--New York City had 198 draft boards, as an example). Researchers interested in the World War I draft registration cards should contact the Atlanta Branch for a supply of forms on which to request copies of the cards. There is a \$5 fee for copies."

The following is an excerpt of names of people who died in the yellow fever epidemic in New Bern and vicinity in September and October of 1864. It is from a book entitled The Great Epidemic in New Berne and Vicinity, September and October, 1864 By One Who Passed Through It by W. S. Benjamin. It was published by Geo. Mills Joy in 1865. I am only extracting the names of the people who died. However, the book is very interesting in its description of many of the prominent citizens whose death it records and its graphic descriptions of the horror of the epidemic. It is well worth reading but is impossible to publish in this newsletter. Mrs. Mary Spiron has a copy of it if anyone is interested in reading more.

Know ye that I the said Ephraim Cotton for in Consideration of the natural love and affection which I have and bear to my son John Cotton of the County and State aforesaid & for devise other good Considerations me thereunto moving have given and granted and by these presents do give and grant unto my said Son John Cotton Four Hundred Acres of land including the plantation whereon I now live Also one Negro Man named James as also all my moveable goods & Chattels & reserving to myself a life Estate on the aforesaid property. To have and to hold & enjoy all and Singular the aforesaid property unto the said John Cotton his heirs Execs. Adms. & assigns to the only proper use and Behoof of the said John Cotton Shall and will warrant and forever defend by these Presents Whereof I the said Ephraim Cotton have hereunto Set my hand and affixed my Seal this 10th day of January Eighteen Hundred & Seven.
