To The Honble the General Assembly of the

State of North Carolina

Whereas your petitioners are informed that the Commissioners to wit, Messers. Stephen Cobb, Joseph Pipkin, and Needham Whitfield appointed by the General Assembly for the purpose of fixing on the most Convenant place nearest the center of the County of Wayne, to erect the Public buildings on, did agree that the same should be at the plantation whereon Mr. John Sasser, lately deceased, which give Satisfaction to your petitions, and the County in general your petitioners are also well assured that two of the said Commissioners, to wit, Mr. Pipkin, and Mr. Whitfield have taken the burthen of the said appointment, and without the knowledge of the other Commissioner, to wit, Mr. Cobb, and have agreed to and appointed that the said buildings shall be erected at a place called West Point on the Neuse River, and have taken a deed of Conveyance from Doc. Bass for three Acres land for that purpose, which place your petitioners humbly Conceive to be inconvenant and burthensome to the Inhabitants of our said County in general, and far distant from the Center of our said County, which is contrary to directions to the said Commissioners, in the Act of Assembly under which they were appointed, your petitioners therefore humbly beg that the general Assembly will take the said greavances into Consideration, and direct and appoint some person or persons to survey and run the lines of our said County in order to find the Center thereof, and make provision that the Court house and other public buildings be Erected at the Center thereof or nearest Convenant place thereto or otherwise as you in your wisdom shall think most for the Convenancy of the Inhabitents in our said County all which your petitioners humbly summit to your Consideration, and as in duty bound will ever prayful. 1st March Anno Dom. 1784

SECRETARY OF STATE VOTER REGISTRATION RECORDS 1902-1908

In a referendum held on 2 Aug 1900 the North Carolina Constitution was amended by the addition of Article VI, Section 4 (generally known as the "Grandfather Clause"), which was to become effective on 1 July 1902, and which provided that no person entitled to vote as of 1 Jan 1867, or at any time prior thereto, and no lineal descendant of any such person could be denied the right to register and vote in any state election by reason of his failure to possess the required educational qualifications.

County list, by townships, were prepared and deposited in the office of the Secretary of State. County lists were prepared in 1902, 1904, 1906, and 1908. The list for 1902 are by far the most comprehensive.

Townships in Wayne in 1902 were: Goldsboro, Fork, Buck Swamp, Brogden, Grantham, Great Swamp, Indian Springs, Nahunta, New Hope, Pikeville, Saulston, Stoney Creek.

MEXICAN WAR ROSTER By Hugh Buckner Johnston

Company B, First North Carolina Regiment of Foot Volunteers (Wayne County), was organized at Goldsboro in January of 1847 by Captain Henry Roberts. This Company entered into the United States Service at Smithville on February 1, 1847, and was discharged at Fort Monroe, Virginia, on July 28, 1848. It may be that the Records of The War Department as preserved in our National Archives contain other details plus a few additional names of men who volunteered after the original roll was prepared.
