

## MINUTES OF OCTOBER MEETING

The regular meeting of the Old Dobbs County Genealogical Society was held Sunday, 13 October 1985 in the Auditorium of the Wayne County Public Library. There were 16 members present and 3 guests.

The meeting was called to order and conducted by President Mary Spiron.

The minutes from the last meeting were read and approved.

Mary announced that a brochure, "Memorial To The Past" by Albert Pate is available for \$2.00.

Mary reported that after extensive research on incorporation of our Society, the Board decided to find out if it were possible to rejoin with the Wayne County Historical Society as an auxillary organization. The following reasons were cited. It would cost \$415 to incorporate, \$50 annually for stamps, file annual income tax report, \$40 for State and \$25 for Seal. She went with Yvonne Hatch, Francis Andrews and Carol Peele to a Board Meeting of the Historical Society and presented the idea of our Society rejoining with them. It was discussed and a motion was made and passed by them to allow us to rejoin as an auxillary organization if our membership so desired.

Mary presented the idea of rejoining the Historical Society to the members. A motion was made by Oscar Bizzell to rejoin the Historical Society and was seconded by Robbie Moye. The motion was passed.

Francis Andrews spoke of upcoming plans of the Wayne County Historical Society and everyone was encouraged to support them by joining and helping where possible.

Mary encouraged everyone to submit pictures to the newspaper if you have them. The newspaper will copy your picture and return it to you. They are interested in printing reunion pictures, older school pictures, class pictures, old homes, etc.

Mary has received a Thank You note from Charlotte Carrere for the plaque given to her at the September meeting which she shared with everyone.

For the November 10, 1985 meeting we will meet at Clyde Moore's museum in Turkey, NC. Everyone is asked to bring a sack lunch. A group will meet at 2:30pm at the Farmers Market with Yvonne Hatch to drive to Clyde Moore's.

Mary apologized for the wrinkling in some of the pages of the newsletter.

It was announced that Mary had stopped at Hunter's Publishing Co. and she reported that the Johnston County books should be in the Johnston Co. library by the last week of October.

\_\_\_\_\_ was presented with a certificate for the work she has done on abstracting names from cemeteries.
