Because the material in the booklet is previously unpublished material we are applying for a copy right on the booklet. It is hole punched for a three ring binder and future lasues of the newsletter will also be hole punched.

At the July meeting the members present voted to order ffive (5) books dealing with Virginia research for the local history room at the public library. These books are: A Hornbook of Virginia History- this is an expanded and update (1983) version of the Hornbook. This books deals with the county formations of Va , and includes those I11., Pa., Ky., and W. Va. counties that were at one point in time part of Va. This book sells for $\$ 7.50$ and may be ordered directly from the Va. State Library, Richmond, Va,

A Guide to Genealogical Notes and Charts in the Archives Branch, Va. State Library This little gem of a book lists alphabettcally pedigrees, genealogical notes that include bible records. Primary collections are alphabetically with an index that cross references the main collections. Cost is $\$ 5.00$ same order address.
Parish Lines, Diocese of Souther Virginia, this book is a must for someone who is trying to determine where a certain parish was located in the early days of Va. This book also sells for $\$^{\$} 5.00$ same ordering address. For your benefit you may need to know that they also have the Parish Ities; Diocese of Southwestern Virginia and Parish lines, Diocese of Virginla, cost of these are $\$ 5$ each same ordering address. Virginia Land Office Inventory, an excellent guide to the Land Office records and a real bargain for $\$ 2.00$ same ordering address.
English Wills: Probate Records in England and Wales: title is misleading as it also
discusses Scottish and Irish wills. It is important to remember that many of the early Va. residents were named in wills filed in the mother company. Cost of this book is $\$ 5.00$ same ordering address.
Carolyn Griffin, our Local History Librarian, has a "want" list and at the top of the list is the book by Murtie June Clark, Colonial Soldiers of the South 1732-1774. This 1,250 page work identifies approximately 55,000 soldiers by name, rank, date, militia company, and district. Other sources used in the book are the size rolls these give name, age, size (i.e.height), country of birth, occupation, and date and
place of enlistment. Carolyn's problem is that this book sells for $\$ 50$ and just isn't in her budget.

Dr. Donald R. Lennon, Director of the East Carolina University Manuscript Collection, was our guest speaker at the July meeting. In addition to an interesting side presentation dealing with the steps take in collection, preservation of material given or solicated to the collection. The University Collection aims at private material and not county records that one would expect to be in the Archives. If. you have family material that you wonld like to donate to the collection they would be most happy to hear from you.

p. 102 Joshua Ammons \& Brother John Ammons - menions Robert G. Green \& Robert Ammons
p. 110 John Davis, Adm'r Barnaby Bulls va Jacob Brooks 3 slaves- that his daughter intermarried with Willis Watson in Month of June 1807-Bulls had bought Negroes at John N. Smiths sale (Betsey wife of Watson)-Barnaby Bulls died intestate leaving Watson \& his daughter surviving him-Watson died and one Jernigan then married widow Watson.

That Risdon Nicholson conveyed same to Thomas Daughtry on 24 Dec 1783, who conveyed same to Frederick Herring on 7 Jan 1784 that Frederick Herring by his will, empowered his Exc's to sell \& on 20 Nov 1805, he being dead, they sold land to defendant. Jury found that Frederick Herring had possession of lands for seven years from 4 June 1784.

The wife died \& then Richard died in 1843 without issue the defendant claims under conveyances in fee made by Richard the son in 1798-the testator left several daughters \& they all died before their father Richard except Sarah Flowers, who is the lessor of the plaintiff-the testator appointed 2 exec's-who died before 1843Adm'r sold premises in fee to William Hollowell.

DOBBS COUNTY: 1780 TAX LIST
(Presentaday Greene and Lenoir Cos., N. C.)
Contributed by Mr. Charies R, Holloman

NOTE BY MR. HOLLOMAN: This tax list covered all of Dobbs County, which in 1780 included lands which later became Giasgow (now Greene) and Lenoir Counties. (Dobbs Co. abolished 1791 and re-created into Glasgow and Lenoir Counties; name of Glasgow changed in 1799 to Greene. Wayne County had been formed from Dobbs at the end of the previous year, 1779, so is not included in this 1780 list.) This 1780 list indicated a total of ten districts which I have assigned numbers from 1 through 10-Districts $\mathrm{No}_{\mathrm{F}} 1,2,3,4,5$, and 9 cover the Lenoir Co. area; Districts No. $6,7,8$, and 10 cover the Greene Co. area. I have arranged the names alphabetically for each of the ten districts. There are two numbers preceding each name; the first name indicates the district, and the second number indicates the order in which the taxpayer appeared; hence, " $1-12$ " means District No. 1, the 12th taxpayer listed." I have also noted the approximate location of each of the ten districts in reference to presentday communities in the area. The total valuation of each taxpayer's property is also given.
