Portions of a letter written by Lucy Hatch LaMotte to her son Major Joseph LaMotte
Georgetown 1; Dec 1857
My Dear Son, Last week I had the pleasure of a letter from yourself, and was very glad to hear all were well, and am very glad to say we also are in the enjoyment of that blessing. Caroline's health I think has improved considerably by her visit to North Carolina, she certainly has gained strength. She was quite debilitated shen she left here last August.

I have not heard from Eveline \&: Margarett for some weeks but hope to hear from them soon. I suppose the distress caused by the failures and suspensions of the banks is felt severly in Texas, as well as all over the Country.

I had a le tter yesterday from Joseph Hatch, your Uncle Richard's son, he is living in Duplin County. He says there is great distress in that section of the country, even anongst the farming community and he fears the consecuences, says if matters should be worse, which will certainly be, there will be a good deal of property sold and at great sacrifice. There are now a good many Negroes now advertised for sale - that kind of property has fallen very much. I did not see Joseph when I was in North Carolina last, he writes me his health is not good.

Cousin. Needham Whitfield and some of his chiloren passed trough ililmington three weeks ago on their way to his son's wedding. He has married rie James 0ldfields Daughter in Lenoir County. I shry... E:en pleased to have had the pleasure to have seen them, you know they are a part of my relations that I esteem very highly.

Lirse Hill (Maria) showed me a le ther from Mr. Lemuel Hatch, he has two daughters married, he mentions his brother Alfred's family all well. I suppose A. H. (Alfred), thinks he feels the pressure of the money matters. He may not find as ready sale for his cotton, perhaps but it is nothing with him who has already so much that he hardly knows :hat to do with his money. It may cause him some uneasiness concerning large amounts he has at interest.
lir. George Whitfield has a dauchter married and living at Hontgomery, Alabama. Her sister is not muite grown, is with her. He has two sons in Alabama, one is a lawyer, the other a doctor. He yas in Morida when I was in :iayne, but spoke of moving to Alabama. The Thitfields often come on to Wayne to see the few of the family that remain there.

I had a letter from your aunt Clarissa Hatch a few days ago. She mentioned all the family were well. Virs, Hill, her sister, had gone to Alabama to see and spend the winter with her brother, Mr. James Rhodes. Mr. Rhodes has two if not three children married.

Mr. Isaac Croom, formerly of Lenoir County, and nowliving in Greensborough, Alabama has given to the University of North Carolina 25 thousand dollars. I think you :lere acnuainted with them.

I assure ynu I enjoyed my visit to Wayne very much, was very sorry I could not remain longer

Kajor Lallotte lived with his family in St. Louis, lissouri after returning from Mexico. He was very active in the Mexican War.
$\because$ Joseph Hatch was married to Anna Wi_liems of Duplin Co.and they were grand par--ents of Cullen B. Hatch of Mount Olive.
