After North Carolina was re-admitted to the Union in 1868, politicians endeavored to avoid changes to the established order by passing legislation requiring proof of literacy in order to vote. However, much of the white male population was unable to acquire the necessary education to vote because of the economic depression following the war. So in 1902 the Voter Registration Act, more popularly known as the Grandfather Clause, was passed. One type of record produced by this Act was the Permanent Registration Books. It contained oaths with the following information: name, age, residence, date of registration, name of the ancestor from whom they were claiming their right, and the state or country in which their ancestor voted. These registration books have been microfilmed by the North Carolina State Archives and are filed with the Secretary of State's records. This transcription is the first in a series of books covering the area of Old Dobs County; the next will be for Lenoir County. Names are arranged alphabetically within townships. A typical entry is from Great Swamp Township: "Simon AYCOCK, age 53, descended from Calvin AYCOCK, who in 1867 voted in North Carolina."

# THE ASSOCIATION FOR THE PRESERVATION OF VIRGINIA ANTIQUITIES 

the virginia settlers research project

The Virginia Settlers Research Project, sponsored by the Association for the Preservation of Virginia Antiquities - the nation's oldest statewide, historic preservation society - seeks to learn as much as possible about the people of seventeenth-century Virginia and to make this knowledge available to the putlic as quickly and easily as possible. To accomplish this, researchers read seventeenth-century documents and extracted the biographical data from them. The information was then coded, keypunched into data processing cards, and entered into the computer. There it was sorted by name to produce THE BIOGRAPHICAL DICTIONARY OF EARLY VIRGINIA, 1607-1660. Funding for the project came from the APVA, from the Richmond (Virginia) Area Manpower Planning Systems and from the National Endowment for the Humanities.

The third (1985) edition of this work is now available from the APVA. The BIOGRAPHICAL DICTIONARY OF EARLY VIRGINIA, $1607-1660$ is an alphabetical listing of 35,075 persons involved in the settlement and development of Virginia through 1660. It contains 128,836 separate entries and 4,175 pages. All of the information about a person, from whatever source derived, was collected together and printed in logical order and in ordinary English in a single listing. Each listing includes all the entries for that person. Each entry includes the event (or fact or happening), the date when and place where it occurred and the source and page from which the information was drawn.

Over 1,000 different events are recorded. They include: birth, baptismal, marriage and death dates; membership in the Virginia Company of London; arrival in Virginia; status - gentleman, Indian, black, servant; landholdings; occupation; activities - economic, legal, (and illegal), military, personal and political; offices held in the church, colony, county or military; and events pertaining to estates, wills and inheritances. Nearly 12,000 genealogical relationships are included - wives and husbands, parents and children, brothers and sisters, uncles, aunts, nieces, nephews, grandparents and grandchildren. Full names (including maiden) of both parties are included where known.

The sources for the information include 48 of the extant manuscript volumes of county court records to 1660, a new edition of the Bristol Port Books, and 54 volumes of printed documents. These include Hening's Statutes, the Journals of the House of Burgesses, the Minutes of the General Court, the 4 volumes of the Records of the Virginia Company of London, John Smith's Works, Brown's Genesis of the United States, Peter Force's rare Tracts, Hotten's Lists of Persons of Quality, the census of $1624 / 25$, and many others.
