YE OLDE FUTRELL FAMILY

In my earliest record of the Futrell Family, I have found the name Thomas Futrell many times, and it comes down to the present generations.

Although this surname sounds of French origin it definitely is not true. The name Futrell is a derivative of Futter, an ancient English family of fame. The name Futrell has had many various spellings such as: FUTTER, FUTTER, FUTRAI, FUTREL, FUTRIL, FUTRIIL, FUTRELL, FUTUL, FUTRALLL, FUTROI, FUTRELLIE, AND FUTRELL, of which all trace back to FUTTER.

From Burke's "General Armory," I found that the Futter Family was located in Norfolk and Stainton, County Suffolk, and Isle of Man, a province of England. This statement was also ascertained by William Berry's "Encyclopedia Heraldica." Aside from the fact that the family FUTTER was located (1844) in Suffolk, neither Burke nor Berry volunteered any information. A search of Continental European names revealed no Futter, but did describe two ^{names} of Futterer from which Futter may have been derived, one was from Nuremburg, the other from Allemannia, a district in South Germany, which today comprises Wurtemberg and Bavaria. The arms of these two are different and differ radically from the British family Futter.

The description of the Coat-of-Arms is as follows:

Arms: Sable between two flaunches, or as many swans in pale proper, membered and beaked of the second.

Crest: A goat's head creased or, attired sable, holding in the mouthe a holly branch vert, fructed gules.

The spelling Futrell has been used for about one hundred and fifty years.

The earliest data I have been able to find is as follows:

A Thomas Futer is listed as having 32 acres of land, no servants and no negroes, on December 20, 1679, in the Parish of St. James, Virginia. (*1)

A Ralph Futere; was knighted in Hertfordshire, England in 1198. (*2)

NOTE: SINCE THE PRECEDING DATA CONCERNING THE ORIGIN OF THE NAME FUTRELL WAS PRINTED IT HAS BEEN ASSERTED BY THE FILES OF THE LIBRARY OF CONGRESS, WASHINGTON, D.C. THAT THE NAME IS OF FRENCH ORIGIN. IN ANOTHER CHAPTER THIS NEW EVIDENCE MAY BE FOUND.

VARIOUS SPELLINGS OF THE MODERN NAME FUTRELL: Vautrel; Fewtrell; Falterellus; Futerel; Fottrell; Fewter; Futter; Fewterer; Vewter; Feuterer; le Vautrer; le Futur; le Wewterer; le Fewtrer; Vewetre; Fetter; Vautier; Fatcher; Futer; Fewter; Futrelle; Futrel; Futtrell; Futril; Futrill; Futel; Futrell; which is the most accepted American version of the family name.

ORIGIN OF THE MODERN NAME FUTRELL

The name Futrell is a variant of the French Vautrel, a hunter. **Reference:** THE NORMAN PEOPLE AND THEIR EXISTING DESCENDANTS IN THE BRITISH DOMINIONS AND THE U.S. OF A.; BY HENRY D. KING AND CO., 65 Cornhill and 12 Paternoster Row, London, 1874.

The Vewter or Fewter Family migrated to England from France, during the Norman Conquest, in 1066. **Reference:** IN HIS WORK, THE NORMAN PEOPLE AND THEIR EXISTING DESCENDANTS IN THE BRITISH DOMINIONS AND THE U.S. OF A., HENRY D. KING AND CO., HE INDICATES THAT THE FAMILY OF FEWTER OR VEWTER WERE NORMAN MIGRANTS.

The Futrell Family remained in England and many were knights. (Ralph Futerel was knighted in 1198 in Hertfordshire, England. THE NORMAN PEOPLE AND THEIR EXISTING DESCENDANTS IN THE BRITISH DOMINIONS AND THE U.S. OF A.), but in the seventeenth century a branch of the family migrated to Virginia. **REFERENCE:** THOMAS FUTRILL IS LISTED AS BEING ABLE TO FURNISH ONE FOOT SOLDIER FOR THE SURRY CO., VA., MILITIA IN 1687; William and Mary Quarterly, Vol. 11, Series 1, page 86.

In the early half of the eighteenth century the Futrell family moved into north eastern, N.C. **Reference:** Thomas Futerel, is listed as paying Quit Rent on 285 acres of land, on September 29, 1729, in Albermarle District, N.C.; N.C. Colonial and State Records, Vol. 22, p. 241.

About the beginning of the nineteenth century the Futrell Family migrated to Christian County, Kentucky. **Reference:** "Among the first summoned away by death in Trigg Co., Ky., were Shadrack Futrell and wife Sarah Futrell; A HISTORY OF CHRISTIAN AND TRIGG COUNTIES, KENTUCKY, BY W. H. PERRIN, 1884.

THE FUTRELL FAMILY

In point of priority in coming to Trigg County, Kentucky, the Futrell Family need bow to few, for William Shadrack Futrell, Nathan Futrell, and John Futrell were first parties of North Carolinians to make a permanent settlement in Trigg County. Actually, after the passage of so many years, it is hard to know who did come first, but regardless of when they came to this locality, it is no mere whimsy of speech to say that the Futrell Family seems as much an integral part of Trigg County as does its hills and rivers.

The name Futrell is not easy to classify. It vaguely suggests a French origin, and if an "e" be added after its first letter, and another at the end, it becomes even more suggestively French. Two books dealing with French surnames failed to reveal it, that is no proof that it is not French origin. On the other hand, four books dealing with English and Welsh surnames were searched without finding it, so obviously it is a most uncommon name. In a sketch of Perry Futrell in Perrin's "History of Trigg County," the statement is made that his father and mother, John and Elizabeth DeLoach Futrell, were of Scotch and English descent. Thus it seems most probable that the name is of Scotch or English derivation, though possibly one that came into England from

France during the Norman Conquest. Odd names are interesting and it should be a desirous task for some Futrell descendant some day to trace the name to its source.

One of the things an American family history should attempt to show is where the emigrant ancestor named first after landing on this side of the water. This is frequently a hard point to determine, and it is particularly so in the case of the Futrell Family. I have not been able to find the name in the daily records of Virginia, or Pennsylvania, the two favorite first settling points for families that later spread into the Carolinas and the other parts of our old South, and it almost seems as if they dropped from the sky into Northhampton County, North Carolina, where they were living as early as 1742 and where five years after the close of the American Revolution the first census showed them as a large and flourishing clan.

The earliest of the name that I have been yet able to find is in the will of John Dickerson, of Northhampton County, N. C. dated on February 4, 1742 probated August 1749. He speaks of his daughter Elizabeth Futrell, Sara Daniel, Rebecca Newsome, Carity Dickerson, Mary Dickerson, and wife Rebecca. (Grimes Abstract of Wills) This apparently shows that there was at least one Futrell living in Northhampton County in 1742, and there were probably more. Northhampton County was formed from a part of Bertie in 1741, and its public records have never been published in book form with the exception of Wills before 1760, to the state or employ someone there to examine them. In the early Bertie records that I have examined, there is no mention of the name Futrell. This may mean the came to this section after

Northampton County was formed, but from where we still do not know.

The first census of Pennsylvania, Virginia, and South Carolina show no one of the name Futrell, and with the exception of one man, Moore Futrell who lived in Onslow County, North Carolina, every Futrell shown in the first census of North Carolina lived in Northampton County, and there were nineteen heads of families named Futrell in that one county in 1790. This is an interesting and unusual example of the extreme concentration of a large family connection within the boundaries of one small area.

PIONEERS

The pioneer Futrell Family of Northampton County, N.C. in the year 1799 started on their long tiresome journey to Nashville, Tennessee.

Nashville must have been too crowded for our Futrells for they remained there for a short while then settling on Donaldson Creek, Christian County (later Trigg in 1820) Kentucky. Ref: A HISTORY OF TRIGG COUNTY, KENTUCKY, by William Henry Perrin, 1884, page 249. From all sources the following definitely made the trip to Kentucky in 1799: William Shadrach Futrell and wife Sarah Lassiter Futrell; John Futrell and wife Elizabeth De Loach Futrell; Thomas Futrell; Daniel Futrell; Winborne Futrell; Hansel Futrell; Nathan Futrell and wife Charity Futrell Futrell; Elizabeth and Rebeca Futrell daughters of William S. Futrell also made the journey.

One of the first distilleries in Trigg County was built in 1811, by James K. Thomas and Shadrach Futrell. They erected the distillery on the land of Allen Shoulder. They operated the distillery with fair success for a period of six or seven years. This was one of the first distilleries in the area. Ref: Perrin's History, page 110.

The first mechanic in Canton, Kentucky was Shadrach Futrell. Ref: Perrin's History, page 111.

Among the first summoned away by death in Trigg Co. were Shadrach Futrell and wife Sarah Futrell who died in 1816. Ref: Perrin's History, page 111.

Among the earliest marriages in Trigg Co. was that of Winborne Futrell and Charity Colson in the year 1809. David Calhoun and Rebecca Futrell, and Cullen Thomas and Elizabeth Futrell were also married at an early date. Ref: Perrin's History, page 111.

Nathan Futrell settled where Laura Furnace has since been located in the southern part of Trigg County in 1820. He owned and improved the tract of land consisting of several acres and he planted the first orchard in Trigg Co. Ref: Perrin's History, page 157.

In the 1820's Fredrick Jones settled the old John Futrell place. Ref: Perrin's History, page 157.

One of the earliest of the primitive grist mills in Trigg County was erected by Nathan Futrell, and stood near where Laura

Furnace was later erected. It was used by the neighborhood for several years and did a good business for a mill of its capacity.

One of the first board of justices or magistrates was Nathan Futrell.

In 1860, when Abraham Lincoln was running for the presidency, the votes of the precinct of Futrell, Kentucky were as follows:

Breckinridge -- 66

Douglas -- 16

Bell -- 31

Lincoln -- 0

In the complete county of Trigg there was only one man who voted for Lincoln, and he was Daniel Webster Futrell, (son of Hansel Futrell).

Nathan Futrell and wife Charity Futrell, along with Daniel Futrell, half-brother of Shadrach (Wm.) Futrell, are buried near Laura Furnace on the old Nathan Futrell Farm.

WILLIAM S. FUTRELL, pioneer settler of Trigg County, Kentucky, was born in North Carolina, about the year 1750. His parents were Saunders Futrell and Court Futrell. Nothing is known about his youth, with the exception that he married Sarah Lassiter in Northampton County, North Carolina, circa 1770.

In the year of our Lord 1799, William S. Futrell, Nathan (his son), Thomas (his son), Sarah (his wife), and two daughters Elizabeth and Rebecca, along with his half-brothers Daniel and John and their families, started the long journey from North Carolina to Kentucky by covered wagon. After the passage of about 3 months, they arrived at Nashville, Tennessee, where they remained only a short time, and then boarded a flat boat and made the journey to Christian (later Trigg) County, Kentucky.

William, the elder brother, and wife Sarah, and two daughters and two sons, to wit:

- A: Nathan Futrell, born September 10, 1773, in Northampton County, N. C. Nathan married Charity Futrell, daughter of Thomas Futrell, who was born in the same county on February 5, 1773. They were married ante 1792, in Northampton County, N. C. Nathan died August 31, 1829, and Charity died August 5, 1872. Both were laid to rest on their farm where Laura Farnace later stood.
- B: Thomas Futrell, born 1794, in Northampton County, N.C. Thomas married Patsy Martha Futrell. Thomas died Post 1850, in Trigg County, Kentucky.

C: Elizabeth Futrell, first daughter of William Futrell, born Circa 1795, in Northampton County, N. C. Elizabeth married Cullen Thomas, born August 21, 1791, on January 31, 1812, in Christian County, Kentucky. Elizabeth died Post 1850, in Trigg County, Kentucky.

D: Rebecca Futrell, second daughter of William S. Futrell and wife Sarah (Lassiter) Futrell, was born in 1787, in Northampton County, N. C. Rebecca married David Calhoun, who was born in 1786.

William S. Futrell, pioneer settler of Trigg County, died in March 1816, in Christian (later Trigg) County, Kentucky. Sarah (Lassiter) Futrell, his wife, died also in 1816.

WILL OF WILLIAM S. FUTRELL

Copied from Will Book C. page 48, entered in March term of court 1816, and probated on Monday, March 4, 1816.

In the name of God-Amen. I William S. Futrell, of the County of Christian and State of Kentucky, being in a very low state of body health at present, but of sound mind and proper memory, and in my proper senses at present, thanks to God for the same, and calling to mind, that it is appointed for all men once to die, do make and ordain this my last will and testament in manner following viz:

First in my will and desire that my friend Levi Lancaster, receive in his hands of my money as much as may satisfy him for all trouble and expenses that he may be at on my account.

Secondly, I give and bequeath unto my beloved brother Daniel Futrell (Note: half-brother) all the balance of my property to wit: one bond against Elliott Futrell and Littleberry Futrell for three hundred forty five dollars and fifty cents (\$345.50) bearing date of November 16, 1815. Also my horse, saddle, bridle and all my wearing apparel and every other article that I am possessor of, to him and his heirs forever.

I do furthermore constitute and appoint my trusty friend Shadrach Futrell, the whole and sole of my executors to this my last will and testament. In testimony whereof I hereunto set my hand and seal this 14th day of February, in the year of our Lord 1816.

The last will and testament of William S. Futrell was this day produced in court and proven by the oath of Isaac Sumner and David Cahoon, subscribing and ordering such to be recorded.

NATHAN FUTRELL, eldest child of William Shadrack Futrell and wife Sarah Lassiter Futrell, was born on September 10, 1773, in Northampton County, North Carolina. Nothing is known of his early life, with the exception that he served in the American Revolution as a drummer boy. Among the invaluable collection of papers given the author by Miss* Minnie and Alice Futrell, of Herndon, Kentucky, was a small yellow slip of paper with the following inscription: 'Jany. 3, 1829, My Consorte Nathan Futrell, served as a drummer player in the North Carolina Militia during the Revolution at the age of seven years.' Signed: Charity Futrell.

Thus our ancestor Nathan Futrell served in the American Revolution and the Paducah, Kentucky Chapter of the Daughters of the American Revolution placed Nathan Futrell's name on a bronze roster of Revolutionary War Veterans of Trigg County in October, 1960. The bronze memorial stands in the Eastend Cemetery Cadiz, Kentucky.

Nathan Futrell married Miss Charity Futrell, the daughter of Thomas Futrell and wife Sarah (Biddle) Futrell, ante 1798 in North Carolina. (Ref: Nathan and Charity Futrell's eldest child Catherine was born in 1798 so they were married prior to this date.) Charity (Futrell) Futrell was born on February 5, 1777, in Northampton County, N.C. Nathan and Charity Futrell and thier infant daughter Catherine migrated west to Kentucky by way of the Cumberland River in 1799. Nathan and family first settled on Donaldson Creek, but in 1820, they removed to the west side of the Cumberland River

buying about two thousand acres of land on the waters of Ford's Creek. Here Nathan built a spacious home. Mr. Charles W. Ross, the great-grandson of Nathan Futrell, told the author in an interview on September 18, 1960 that the Nathan Futrell home was directly across the road from the site of the 'Old Laura Furnace stack.' He said it was a two story log with a 'dog-trot' through the center of the lower floor. Mr. Ross who was circa 80 at the time of the interview said he could distinctly remember the old home as a child when his mother took him to visit her grandfather's grave which was located on a hill behind the house. (The grave of Nathan Futrell) Mr. Ross further stated that his great grandmother Charity Futrell, the wife of Nathan Futrell, kept a tavern and inn in her large home from about 1855 to 1860 for the frequenting of workers of Laura Furnace.

Nathan Futrell erected one of the earliest of the primitive grist mills in Trigg County. One of the first board of justices or magistarates of Trigg County was Nathan Futrell. He received his appointment on October 29, 1824 from Governor Joseph Desha. Nathan was a surveyor, magistrate, farmer, election officer, and mechanic as evidenced by official documents.

In the 1820 United States Census of Trigg County he was listed as follows: 3 white males under 10; 2 white males of 10 and under 16; 1 white male of 16 and under 26; 1 white male of 45 and up; 1 white female under 10; 1 white

female of 10 and under 16; 1 white female of 26 and under 45; and 4 Negro slaves. In TRIGG COUNTY**GATEWAY TO THE JACKSON PURCHASE by Burie Pearl Neel Nathan Futrell was listed as the presiding judge of the election of August 8, 1829 at Forgeron Precinct in Trigg County. In an Abstract of Order Book #A, Trigg County, Kentucky, page 6, 'on Tuesday, 16th. of May, 1820 it was ordered that Nathan Futrell appointed as a viewer to mark a road from Dover to Eddyville.' In the same order book, page 168 'Nathan Futrell authorized to solemnize the right of matrimony.' In the same order book page 56 Nathan Futrell was appointed surveyor for division of estate of Charles Anderson.

Charity (Futrell) Futrell was a charter member of Pleasant Hill Baptist Church in the Laura Furnace precinct.

On August 31, 1829, Nathan Futrell died in his home at the age of fifty six. Since he had served as an election judge only 23 days prior to his death the fatal illness must have been of a rapid nature. The body was lain to rest on a hill opposite Laura Furnace. I. Rebecca Futrell, born on April 5, 1818, in Trigg County, Ky. Rebecca Futrell Hicks died on August 26, 1886 in Trigg County, Kentucky.

JUNIUS MARION FUTRELL, son of Jephtha Futrell, and wife Arminia ? Futrell, was born on August 14, 1872, in Greene County, Arkansas. Junius Marion Futrell attended local Greene County, Arkansas schools. Mr. Futrell then attended the University of Arkansas in 1892, where he graduated in 1893.

On September 14, 1893, Junius Marion Futrell married Miss Tera Ann Smith, of Independence County, Arkansas.

Mr. Futrell began as a school teacher in 1892. He was later a teacher, farmer, and Circuit Court clerk, of Greene County, Arkansas. He was admitted to the Arkansas bar in 1913. He was a member of the Arkansas House of Representatives in 1897-1899, and 1901-1903. Was a state senator 1913-1917, president of the Senate, 1913-1915. Mr. Futrell acted as governor of Arkansas, five months, from March 13, 1913 to August 1913, served as Circuit Judge in 1922, and state Chancellor, 1923-1933.

Mr. Futrell was elected Governor of Arkansas in 1933 and served two terms, ending in 1937.

After his resignation as Governor, Mr. Futrell did special legal work for Dyess Colony, Inc., in Little Rock. Mr. Futrell resided at 4121 Woodlawn Avenue, Little Rock, Arkansas until his death in 194-.

THOMAS FUTRELL, son of _____ ? _____ Futrell, was born Circa 1695 in North Carolina, probably Albemarle County, or Curry County, Virginia. It is possible that he was the son of Thomas Putrill mentioned on page _____. Thomas Futrell married Hannah _____ ?, Circa 1715 in North Carolina.

Thomas Futrell was appointed on Monday, February 25, 1739, when his name was read before the General Assembly, of North Carolina, and elected as a juror for Bertie and Edgecombe Counties, of North Carolina. (Ref: Colonial Records of North Carolina, Vol. 4, 521.) From the same record I found that on June 12, 1735, Thomas Futrell paid one-half of the Quit Rents for Albemarle County, (Vizt.) to "His Majesty," from September 29, 1729 - March 1732, for 285 acres of land, amount paid being \$7.00 of American currency for one pound of English sterling, thus being equal to 4-19-0. On June 22, 1749 Thomas Futrell received a large land grant being number 123, receiving land in North East Hunnington Quarter Swamp. (Ref: North Carolina Land Grant Office, Raleigh, N. C.)

On March 27, 1770, Thomas Futrell made his last will and testament. In his will he named his beloved wife Hannah, and the following children:

C: Dempsey, born Circa 1735 in North Carolina. Dempsey married

(Dempsey Sr. and Dempsey Jr. were both in the American Revolution. Ref: N. C. State Archives.)

D: Jesse Futrell, was born Circa 1740 in North Carolina. Jesse married Lyda _____, and had the following children: David Futrell, Henry Futrell, Sarah Futrell, Elizabeth Futrell, Anne Futrell, Rachel Futrell. Jesse made his will on Sept. 7, 1780 in Will Book 1, 1741-1787, in Northampton County, N. C.

Saunders Futrell, son of Thomas and wife Hannah, was born in North Carolina, Circa 1730. Saunders Futrell married twice, his first wife was Courtland _____, and his second wife being Charity _____.

Saunders Futrell and his first wife had nine children to wit:

Daniel Futrell secondly married Miss Polly Burden on December 24, 1814, in Christian County, Kentucky. The service was performed by Rev. Dudley William. (Ref: Christian County Marriage Book A, page 10, 1797 to 1817.)

On October 16, 1804 Daniel Futrell received a land survey of 213 acres on Donaldson Creek, Christian (later Trigg County), Kentucky. (Ref: Survey Book No. 3, page 158.)

B. John Futrell who married Elizabeth De Loach. (more later) Saunders Futrell made his last will and testament on Sept. 24, 1803 in Northampton County, North Carolina. His will was filed in Will Book 2, Volume 2, 1787-1803, Northampton County, N. C., pp. 272, 273. This will was probated in the December term of court in the year 1804, at Northampton County, N. C. Thus Saunders Futrell died in the year 1804.

WINBORNE FUTRELL, son of Daniel Futrell and his first wife, was born in 1791. (Ref: 1850 U. S. Census of Kentucky.) Winborne was born in Northampton County, North Carolina. Winborne migrated to Kentucky with his father in the year of our Lord 1799, first settling on Donaldson Creek, removing to between the rivers. about the year 1820.

Winborne Futrell was married three times, to wit:

1. Charity Colson, in 1809, Perrin's History states this was among the first marriages in the Donaldson Creek section of Trigg County.
2. Sarah Colson, on April 27, 1814, in Christian County, Kentucky.

Winborne Futrell served under Capt. Williams Company of Kentucky militia as a private during the War of 1812. Winborne died near Laura Furnace, Trigg County, Kentucky during the year of 1860. A bronze plaque, which was given by the United States Government to Roger Futrell, has been placed in the Futrell Memorial Plot, at Westend Cemetery, in Cadiz, Kentucky. The plaque reads: Winborne Futrell, Kentucky, Private, Capt. Williams Company, Kentucky Militia, born 1791 died 1860.

First: I give to my children which were by my first wife, Court Futrell, Elliott Futrell, Elizabeth Lassiter, Abigail Futrill, Millia Futrill, Littleberry Futrill, Noah Futrill, Rachel Futrill, Phillis Futrill, and Hosa Futrill, the land and plantation where I now live to be equally divided between them all and to them and their heirs forever.

Second: I give and bequeath unto my son William Futrell my sheep, chickens, cattle and other live-stock.

(This will is in very poor condition and the original, which is in the State Department of Archives and History, Raleigh, North Carolina, cannot be accurately read beyond bequest item two.)

I nominate constitute and appoint my beloved son Elliott Futrell, my whole sole executor to this my last will and testament, in witness whereof, I the said Saunders Futrill have here unto set my hand and affixed my seal this 24th. day of September in the year of our Lord 1803.

HANSEL FUTRELL, the second son of Daniel Futrell and his first wife, was born in the year 1798, in Northampton County, North Carolina. RICHARD (RICKS) FUTRELL, second child and first son of Nathan and Charity (Putrell) Futrell, was born on February 5, 1802, in Christian (now Trigg) County, Kentucky. Ricks Futrell married Miss Sarah Outland, daughter of Josiah and Amey (Hale) Outland, his wife, on May 5, 1825. Josiah Outland, father of Sarah (Outland) Futrell, was born in North Carolina, and came to Christian (now Trigg) County, Kentucky, about the year 1800, with his brother Enos Outland. Ref: A HISTORY OF CHRISTIAN COUNTY, KENTUCKY, by Charles Mayfield Meachem, page 25. In the authors possession is an affidavit written on February 4, 1837, by Sarah (Outland) Futrell giving her brother Josephas Outland the right to any property left to her by her father, the late Josiah Outland. Thus Josiah Outland died before February 4, 1837. This affidavit states that he died in Calloway County, Kentucky. Sarah (Outland) Futrell was born in 1805, in Christian (now Trigg) County, Kentucky. Ricks Futrell and Sarah were both members of the Missionary Baptist Church, of Trigg County, Kentucky. Ricks was a very devout Democrat and a strong Baptist in religion.

Ricks received a land grant from the Commonwealth of Kentucky, on February 8, 1832, number 2874, Book 5, page 61 (in Frankfort, Kentucky). It contained all of the S. W. Quarter Section 20, Township 2, Range 5, N. E. of Murray, Calloway County, Kentucky. Ricks and his wife sold this land to her brother Josephus Outland, in June of 1839. Ref: Book C, page 86, Calloway Co., Court House, Murray, Kentucky.

Ricks was a wheelright and cabinet maker. Ricks died on May 2, 1851, in Trigg County, Ky. Sarah (Outland) Futrell survived him for fifteen years, dying in March, 1866. During the War Between the States, Sarah lost much of her property and gold.

The Richard Futrells had four children, to wit:

JOHN FUTRELL, son of Saunders Futrell and wife Charity Futrell, was born in the year 1734, in Northampton County, North Carolina. John Futrell married Elizabeth De Loach in Northampton County, North Carolina. Elizabeth (De Loach) Futrell was born in Northampton County, North Carolina, in 1783.

John Futrell migrated to Christian (later Trigg) County, Kentucky in 1799. Upon arrival to Kentucky John traded one flintlock rifle for about 300 acres of land, where he built his first home in Trigg County. The home was a pole structure, very primitive, destitute of floor, with a chimney built of clay and punchoons, greased paper served for windows, a door of hewed poles, roof made of birch clapboards fastened securely with pegs. This primitive home, much like that of Abraham Lincoln's birthplace, was built about 1800, in the Laura Furnace vicinity, of Trigg County, Kentucky. John Futrell is buried on a large hill overlooking the cabin. (Ref: for above; statement to author from Mrs. Viola (Futrell) Bailey.)

According to William Henry Perrin's History of Trigg County, John Futrell served in the Indian Wars, or the War of 1812. The author received a bronze plaque and it has been placed in the Futrell Memorial Plot, in Eastend Cemetery at Cadiz, Kentucky. It reads as follows: John Futrell, Kentucky, Pvt. Capt. Reeves Co. Kentucky Militia, War of 1812, 1784-1870.

John Futrell was a progressive farmer, and a faithful member of the Baptist Church. John Futrell died Circa 1873, in Trigg County, Kentucky, being about ninety years of age. Elizabeth (De Loach) Futrell died in 1828, being forty-five years of age.

John Futrell and Elizabeth (De Loach) Futrell had four children, to wit:

PERRY FUTRELL, farmer, was born in Trigg County, Kentucky, October 23, 1814, and was a son of John and Elizabeth (De Loach) Futrell, both natives of North Carolina, and of English descent. John Futrell emigrated to Kentucky Circa 1799, and settled on Donaldson Creek, in Trigg County. He was a farmer, was engaged in the Indian War in Indiana, (War of 1812). He was a devoted member of the Baptist Church, and died Circa 1873. Perry Futrell was educated in Trigg County, and remained with his parents until 1836, when he married Elizabeth Colson, born 1816, a native of Kentucky. Eleven children were born to this union, of whom seven are still living. Mr. Futrell has followed farming all of his life. He began life with nothing and now owns two-hundred and eighty acres, one hundred and twenty of which are under cultivation. Mr. Futrell is one of the oldest and most highly respected citizens of the County of Trigg. (Ref: Perrins Trigg County History, page 248.) Perry Futrell died in 1901.

Perry Futrell made his will on May 4, 1896, and it is recorded in Will Book J, page 272, Trigg County, Kentucky. Perry Futrell's children were:

Futrell was the son of John and Elizabeth (DeLoach) Futrell; his parents were born in North Carolina, they were married and came to Christian, (later Trigg) County, at an early date. His mother died in 1828, aged 45; on coming here to the courts in Hopkinsville it was held in black jack poles. From Hopkinsville to Donaldson's Creek there was no growth of timber; a riding switch could not even be obtained. On their arrival to Nashville, Tennessee, from Northampton County, North Carolina, there were but three stores; and but one in Hopkinsville. Soloman D. Futrell bought a farm at the age of twenty-one, and remained there eight years. He then bought eighty acres of land which he improved and then sold. He later bought two-hundred and thirty acres, largely improved, all of which he acquired by his attention to business and judicious management. He married in 1846, to Clarissa Futrell. She was born in Trigg County, in the year 1831. They have had ten children, seven of whom are now living, four sons and three daughters. Soloman D. Futrell died Circa 1910 in Trigg County. (Copied from Perrin's Trigg County History, page 246.)

CASWELL FUTRELL, was born April 30, 1840, in Trigg County, Kentucky. Caswell Futrell was a son of Perry Futrell and Elizabeth (Colson) Futrell. The father and mother were both born in Trigg County, Kentucky. Our subject was reared on his father's farm. On arriving at his majority, he bought a farm of one-hundred and six acres; he later increased this to one-hundred and fifty four acres, which he improved, all of which has been done by his own industry. Mr. Futrell was married to Rebecca Futrell, who was also born in Trigg County, Kentucky. Caswell enlisted in Company D, Second Kentucky Cavalry, in the year 1862, and served his enlistment. Caswell Futrell died in 19____. (Ref: Perrin's Trigg County History, page 249.)

WILL OF THOMAS (FUTREL) FUTRELL

In the name of God, Amen, I Thomas Futrell of Northampton County, being of sound and perfect mind and memory, belefted be to God, do this Twenty-second day of October, in the year of our Lord, one thousand seven hundred and nintey six, do make and publish this my last will and testament in manner following, that is to say first, I reccommend my soul to God, who prepareth it.

Item 1: I give to my beloved son Shadrach Futrell, one negro girl, Venie, to him and his heirs forever.

Item 2: I lend my plantation whereon I now live, to my beloved wife, Sarah Futrell, during her life. Also one negro girl, Silve, during her natural life, and after her death, my plantation I give to my beloved son Thomas Futrell, and his heirs forever.

Item 3: I give to my son Thomas Futrell, one negro boy, Abram, to him and his heirs forever.

Item 4: I give to my beloved son John Futrell, a tract of land, containing one hundred acres, that I bought of Jack Futrel, to him and his heirs forever. Also, one negro girl, named Jane, to him the said John Futrell, and his heirs forever.

Item 5: I give and bequeath to my beloved daughter, Charity Futrel, one bed and bedstead, and one chest, to her and her heirs forever.

Item 6: I give to my daughter Fathy Futrel, one bed and bedstead, to her and her heirs forever.

And all the remainder of my estate, which I have not given away to be sold and equally divided between daughters Barsheba Colson, Patsy Sumner, Charity Futrel, Fathy Futrel, Amey Futrel,

Rebekah Futrel, and Elizabeth Futrel, and Clarissa Futrel, to them and their heirs forever. Alas, I give to my daughter Barshaba Colson 60 five Silver Dolloars, also I give to my youngest daughter, Clarissa Futrel, twenty pounds Virginia money. Also, I give to youngest son Thomas Futrel, twenty pound Virginia money in cash, exclusive of what, and at the death of beloved wife the negro woman Silve, to be sold and equally divided amongst all my children. I do hereby ordein and appoint my son Shadrach Putrell, my executor of this my last will and testament, in witness whereof I the said Thomas Futrel, have here-unto set my hand and affixed my seal the day and date above written.

LETTER WRITTEN BY L. S. FUTRELL

(no date, between 1905-1906)

I feel under obligation to you for your favor. I know that it was the 2nd Kentucky Cavalry Regiment; but had got the letter of the Co. mixed, I could not decide whether it was B or D., as nearly 40 years has elapsed since I left the Confederate Camp at Gainsville, Alabama. L. S. Futrell was born December 24, 1831, in Stewart County, Tennessee, and died September 17, 1906, in Rockwall, Texas. He was married the 1st day of January, 1856, was a member of the United Baptist Church; was a soldier in the War Between the States, belonging to Company D, Second Kentucky Cavalry, under Captain Slaughter. He emigrated to Texas March 4, 1905, and was delighted with the sunny climate. We have a sweet assurance that our loss here on earth is his eternal gain.

I find on examination of my grandfather's old Bible. It was printed by the Assigns of Alexander Kincaid his Majesty's printer. It was printed in MDCCLXXXVI or 1786, with the following record:

Shadrach Futrell was born July 6, 1770.
Charlot Johnson, his wife was born December 9, 1771.
Shadrach Futrell was married December 27, 1792 And had 8 childdren that lived to mature age, 4 boys and 4 girls, 7 of whom were born in Northampton County, North Carolina. He emigrated to Ky. in the year 1812. I have no record of his death.

Isaac Futrell my father was born December 25, 1796, died August 1836.
L. S. Futrell and John C. Futrell sons of Isaac Futrell.

Permela Vinson and daughter of Shadrach Futrell and Charlott his wife was born 29, of March 1795. She is still living.
Salley Futrell, born December 31, 1810, who is the widow of Dosy Griffen, and is still living.

I give you the above list I cannot say that it is correct in every item, but it is the best I can give you from the faded record that I have before me. And I may be mistaken as to the number of children my grandfather had. He had two brothers in this country, John and Thomas, and 7 or 8 sisters I could give you their names and ages.

THE COOK FAMILY

The Cook Family is among the 49 "best families" selected by the American Historical-Genealogical Society.

The Cook Family has been prominent in the British Empire and in the United States, its members having played important parts in war and in peace. Family pride is a commendable trait and should be cultivated.

Our "Cooks" are relics of the old "Le Cook," "Le Coke," or "Cokeman."

The Angle-Saxon form is "Cuc," "Cucca." "Coke" is one of the earliest forms and in the Domesday Book there are several tennats styled "Cocus," and one "Quidam Coquus Regis."

The Cook Coat of Arms is the Arms of the Northumberland and Yorkshire; Doncaster, County York, with slight variations, of other lines of the name. This is the most widely used of all Cook Coats of Arms, and has been in existence for many centuries. It is described in Burke's General Armory, Burke's Landed Gentry, Burke's Peerage and Baronage, and other reliable sources on Heraldry. The Coat of Arms is as follows:

ARMS: Or, a Cherron gules between two lions passant, reguardant, sable.

CREST: Out of a Mural Coronet argent, a demi-lion rampant
sable, gorged with a ducal coronet or.

MOTTO: Tutum monstrat iter (Latin)

TRANSLATION: He showeth a safe road.

The Cooks came from the British Isles to America. (Ref:
The previous was takes from "The Cook Genealogy," by J.
Montgomery Smith.)

OUR COOK FAMILY IS AS FOLLOWS:

JOHN COOK, was born in South Carolina, in the year 17___. John
Cook married Miss Ruth Moultrie, daughter of _____ Moultrie
and wife _____ Moultrie, in the year 17___, in South
Carolina. In the year 1805, the John Cook family was living
in St. David's Parish, Chesterfield District, South Carolina,
became his daughter Levica Cook, was born in this district in
the same year. Ruth Moultrie, his wife, was born in South
Carolina, in the year 17___. Family tradition and written
documents, compiled by her grandson, in 1906, tend that she
was a descendant of the famous Dr. John Moultrie of Charleston,
South Carolina, whose ancestry goes back to the fourteenth
century. Due to the condition of the South Carolina State and
County Records, the author has been unable to connect the
lineage. Two professional genealogists of Charleston, South
Carolina, have insured the author that this Ruth (Moultrie)
Cook, is definitely connected with this prominent family.

Chesterfield District, South Carolina, where the family lived, was formed as a district from Old Cheraws District. Some of the records of Old Cheraws District are in Marlboro County, South Carolina, at the present time. Chesterfield was formed in 1798, and it was located in St. David's Parish, and the 1790 Census of this district is listed under Cheraws District. In a letter dated February 18, 1960, from L. C. Norton, Jr., Clerk of the Court, Marlboro County, Bennettsville, S. C., he states: "I have found two deeds in the 1700's recorded in this office in the name of one John Cook." Then he gave the following synopsis of these deeds:

1. Year 1791, 140 acres of land from John Stubbs to John Cook, located on North East side of Pee Dee River, District of Old Cheraws.
2. Year 1794, 396 acres of land from Wilson Conner to John Cook, located on the North East side of Pee Dee River, District of Old Cheraws.

These deeds were most probably to our ancestor, John Cook, because they occurred during his lively-hood, and he was a resident of Old Cheraws District, before Chesterfield was formed in 1798.

Ruth (Moultrie) Cook, wife of John Cook, with her ten children, came to Christian County, Kentucky, previous to October 9, 1816, because her son, Joseph Moultrie Cook, married Patsy Lindsay in this county on this date. After residing in Christian Co., Kentucky, for three or four years, Ruth (Moultrie) Cook and some members of her family moved to Stewart Co.,

Tennessee, where she was residing on November 21, 1825, when Mr. James Lindsay of Trigg and State of Kentucky deeded property lying on the south side of the Cumberland River in Trigg County, Kentucky, to Ruth (y) Cook, of County of Stewart and State of Tennessee. (Ref: Trigg County Deed Book B, page 226, Trigg County, Court House, Cadiz, Kentucky.) This deed was witnessed by Blount Cook and Nathan Futrell. Ruth (Moultrie) Cook deeded property to John Cook, Jr., and others in Stewart Co., Tennessee. (Ref: Book 7, page 216.) About the year 1828, Ruth (Moultrie) Cook moved back into Kentucky and resided in Trigg County, Kentucky until her death in 18__.

On Sunday, January 10, 1960, the author's grand-uncle, Mr. Walter Futrell, of Hopkinsville, Kentucky, stated that his father, the late James Madison Futrell, showed him the exact burial plot of Ruth (Moultrie) Cook, it being located on the old Finis Berkley Farm, which is now owned by Percy Berkley, in the Laura Furnace community of Trigg County, Kentucky. It will possibly be covered by water when the Barkley Dam is completed in 1964. John Cook and wife Ruth (Moultrie) Cook had ten children to wit:

1. Joseph Moultrie Cook, eldest child of John Cook and Ruth (Moultrie) Cook, his wife. Joseph Moultrie Cook married Patsy Lindsay on October 9, 1816. (Ref: Marriage Book A, page 8, Christian County Court House.) In deed Book A, page 438 and 439 in Trigg County, Kentucky, Spencer Griffen deeded property on January 8, 1824, to Joseph Moultrie Cook and his father-in-law, James Lindsay.

2. John Cook, Jr., married Ann Witty on January 4, 1817.
(Ref: Marriage Book A, Christian County Court House, Hopkinsville, Kentucky.)
3. Levica Cook, born on March 2, 1805, in Chesterfield District, South Carolina. Levica Cook married Isaac Futrell on April 21, 1824, in Stewart Co., Tennessee. Levica (Cook) Futrell died in Trigg County, Kentucky, on September 16, 1869. (Refer to biography of Isaac Futrell, son of Shadrack Futrell and wife Charlott (Johnson) Futrell.)
4. Daniel Cook.
5. James Cook, married Mary Kenedy on March 19, 1828, in Trigg Co., Kentucky. (Ref: Trigg County Marriage Book A, p. 24.)
6. William Cook, born in 1810, in South Carolina. William Cook married Nonia _____, who was born in Kentucky, in 1815.

HISTORY OF THE OLD CHERAWS CONTAINING AN ACCOUNT OF THE ABORIGINES OF THE PEDEE. EXTENDING FROM ABOUT A.D. 1730 to 1810. By The RIGHT REV. ALEXANDER GREGG, D.D. FORMER RECTOR OF ST. DAVID'S CHURCH, CHERAW, SO. CA. 1905.

P. 435--"Such records of the County Courts as have been preserved, exhibit but little matter of interest. The country was sorely embarrassed with debt, and suits were numerous. There were many prosecutions in the County Courts, particularly for cow stealing, which appears at that period to have been the most frequent crime. The only presentment which has been found, was one made in Chesterfield, March 13, 1787; and the only subject matter of it, certain persons therein named, as having been guilty of offences against the public morals. The grand jury on this occasion, so far as the names appear on the records, consisted of the following persons:--Thomas Ellerbe, Foreman; Wm. Lyons; Ephraim Horne; Abraham Cook; John Evans; Thomas Leonard; Benjamin Outlaw; Jason Meadow; Joel Yarborough; Joseph Booth; Joseph Powell; John Blakeney; Moses Hollis; and John Carter."

P. 435--"Many of the records of Chesterfield County remain in a good state of preservation. But few are to be found in the public offices of Marlborough, and unfortunately for the history of justice as administered in Cheraws District, all the Circuit Court records, with those of Darlington County, were destroyed by the burning of of the Court House about 1804.2

P. 436 -- Three counties made up the Cheraws District:
Marlborough; Chesterfield, and Darlington.

PP. 404 -405-406-"The following very imperfect list collected from the Archives of the State, will give, in addition to those already mentioned, embracing also some of them, the names of not a few others on the Pedee, who took part in the war, and fitly bring this narrative of the Revolution to a close.

Cook, William, sergeant and private in Continental line-1782.

PP. 461 & 462--"About the year 1800, the total militia of the State, according to the most reliable returns, was supposed to be 35,785. The Cheraw brigade, No. 9, numbered 2224. On the 29th. of November, of this year, the following return was made of the Chesterfield regiment, Colonel Spencer commanding, viz;--"A GENERAL RETURN OF 39th. REGIMENT OF THE S.C. MILITIA, COMMANDED BY COLONEL CALVIN SPENCER*-Field and Commissioned Officers; 2nd. Bat., Capt. Daniel Cook. The preceding was certified by John P. Rushing, Major on the 29th. November, 1800."

1. Roger Henry Lofland Futrell, born April 3, 1943, in Clark Co., Indiana, the only child of Henry Lawrence Futrell and wife, Bernice Irene (Banton) Futrell.
2. Henry Lawrence Futrell, born March 13, 1904, in Trigg County, Kentucky, the son of Ira Futrell and wife, Talmadge (Bland) Futrell. Henry Lawrence Futrell, married Miss Bernice Irene Banton on December 24, 1932, in Hopkinsville, Christian County, Kentucky. To this union was born one son: Roger Henry Lofland Futrell.
3. Ira Futrell, born on September 15, 1882, in Trigg County, Kentucky, the son of James Madison Futrell and wife, Cynthia Susan (Green) Futrell. Ira Futrell married Talmadge Bland on January 30, 1903, in Canton, Trigg County, Kentucky. To this union were born six children: Henry Lawrence; Thomas Locket; Virginia Dare; Dolly; Julia Frances; and Katherine, who died in infancy. Ira Futrell died on April 25, 1949, in Hopkinsville, Kentucky, and was interred in Riverside Cemetery, Hopkinsville.
4. James Madison Futrell, born October 31, 1856, in Trigg County, Kentucky, the eldest son of L. S. Futrell and wife,

- Charity (Futrell) Futrell. James Madison Futrell married Miss Cynthia Susan Green on June 22, 1877, in Trigg County, Kentucky. To this union were born ten children, of which four raised prosperous families. James Madison Futrell died in Christian County, Kentucky on May 22, 1941. Cynthia Susan (Green) Futrell, his wife, died March 23, 1950.
5. L. Shadrach Futrell, born on December 24, 1831, in Stewart County, Tennessee, the son of Isaac Futrell and wife, Levica (Cook) Futrell. L. S. Futrell married Miss Charity Futrell, daughter of Ricks and wife, Sarah (Outland) Futrell, on January 3, 1856, in Trigg County, Kentucky. To this union were born five children: James Madison Futrell; Mary Caroline; Isaac; Andrew Jackson; and Mastin Cook Futrell.
6. Isaac Futrell, born on December 25, 1796, in Northampton County, North Carolina, the son of Shadrack Futrell and wife, Charlotte (Johnson) Futrell. Isaac Futrell married Miss Levica Cook, daughter of John Cook and wife Ruth (Moultrie) Cook, on April 21, 1824, in Stewart County, Tennessee. To this union were born four children: James Calvin Futrell; L. S. Futrell; Louisiana Futrell; and John Calvin Futrell. Levica (Cook) Futrell, his wife, was born in Chesterfield District, South Carolina, on March 2, 1805.
7. John Cook, born in 17__, in South Carolina. John Cook married Miss Ruth Moultrie, daughter of _____ Moultrie and wife _____ Moultrie. Ruth Moultrie was born in 17__ in South Carolina. John Cook died in Chesterfield.

District, South Carolina, about the year 1814. Ruth (Moultrie) Cook and her family moved to Kentucky and Tennessee in the year 1816, where she died in Trigg County, Kentucky, in the year 18__.

8. _____ Moultrie. (Possibly Lt. William Moultrie, Jr.)
9. _____ Moultrie. (Possibly Gen. William Moultrie)
10. Dr. John Moultrie, born in 1702, in Culross, Shire of Fife, Scotland. He was the son of John Moultrie and wife, Catherine (Craik) Moultrie. Dr. John Moultrie was living in Charleston, South Carolina, in the year 1729. He returned to Edinburgh where he received the degree of M. D. He went back to Charleston in 1729. He married (1) Lucretia Cooper, by whom he had four sons, John, Lieutenant of Florida; William, Major General in the war of the American Revolution and Governor of South Carolina; James, Chief Justice of Florida; and Thomas, a Captain in the 2nd Regt. in the American Revolution. He married (2) Elizabeth Mathewes by whom he had one son, Alexander, the first Attorney General of South Carolina. John Moultrie, the emigrant, died in Charleston, South Carolina, in the year 1771.
11. John Moultrie, the younger son of James Moultrie, married Miss Catherine Craik at Culross near Rescobie. By her he had issue: John, born 1702, and a daughter, Anna, born in 1703, who married Cruikshank, Superior of Excise, who died in Glasgow.

12. James Moultrie, inherited the estates of Roscobie in 1686. He died in 1710, leaving two sons: James, who succeeded him as laird of Roscobie, and John, who lived in the parish of Culross and married Catherine Craik by whom he had a son and daughter. This James Moultrie was the son of James Moultrie and wife, Maria (Law) Moultrie.
13. James Moultrie, laird of Roscobie after his father, Robert Moultrie, married in 1646, Maria Law, daughter of George Law of Brienton, and granddaughter to Archbishop Law of Glasgow, by her, her had three sons: John, Robert, and James Moultrie.
14. Robert Moultrie succeeded his father, Robert Moultrie, in the estate of Seafield Tower about the year 1620. Robert Moultrie married Miss Lady Ann Ershine, daughter of John Earl of Marr, a lineal descendant of Malcolm (III) Canmore King of Scotland and Edmund Ironside, one of the Saxon Kings of England. This Robert sold the famous Tower of Seafield to Archbishop Law of Glasgow, in the year 1631, for 19,700 marks. Among their children was James Moultrie who married Maria Law. (See data on Malcolm III.)
15. Robert Moultrie, inherited Seafield Tower in 1618. He married Jeane Drummond. His younger brother, Alexander Moultrie, married Isabel Drummond and had one son and daughter.
16. George Moultrie (Moultray), succeeded to the property in 1579. He married Elizabeth Stewart and left three sons: Henry, Robert, and Alexander.

17. John Moultrie succeeded his father, John Moultrie, in 1540. He is known to have had one son, George.
18. John Multrare inherited the estates in 1504. He married the fifth daughter of Sir Alexander Stewart of Garlies. He is known to have had one son, the above John Moultrie.
19. John Moultrie succeeded his father, Thomas, in 1500. After holding the estates of Seafield and Markinch for four years, he died, leaving two sons, John and Richard.
20. Thomas Moultrie succeeded his father, John, in the year circa 1478. In 1481, he married, by dispensation, Katherine Bosville (Boswell) of Balmuto near Seafield. She was the fifth daughter of David Boseville, a lineal descendant of Sieur Robert de Boseville, a man of high rank in the court of King William the Lion, who succeeded to the throne of Scotland in A.D. 1165. The first of the Bosevilles on record accompanied William the Conqueror from Normandy and commanded a division of the Norman Army at the Battle of Hastings in 1066.
21. John Multrare succeeded his father, Richard, in the Seafield and Markinch estates in 1469. Little is known of him except that his wife's name was Gelis ("Heloise"). His name appears as Commissioner in the Scottish Parliament of James III, from 1469-1478.
22. Richard Multrare of Seafield Tower and Markinch, received a Royal charter confirming to him the Seafield and Markinch lands in 1443. This is the earliest mention of the family

as connected with these estates so far as have yet been discovered. Mariota Multrare had the lands of perdoming in Fife settled upon by her marriage in 1449 with John Strang of Balcaske--in Fife.

The Moultrie of Scotland, Lairds of Seafield, Merkinch and Roscobie, whose name is also spelled in the old manuscripts and charter, "Moutrays," "Mowtrays," "Moultreres," and "Moultrays," had their family seat at the tower of Seafield on the Firth of Forth near Edinburgh, Scotland, which estates was confirmed to Richart Moultrare by Royal Charter in 1443.

ADAME DE MULTRERE swore fealty to King Edward I, at Berwich-on-Tweed, with the other Scottish gentry in A.D. 1292.

ROBERT MULTRARE received in 1365 a Royal Charter from David II, son of the Bruce, granting him lands in the barony of Lastalryk (Restalrig) which had been confiscated for treason from John Coltus, their late possessor.

EDMUND II

Edmund or Eadmund II (called Edmund Ironside) b. probably circa 989; d. probably at London, Nov. 30, 1016. King of the West Saxons. He was the son of Ethelred II, whom he succeeded in April 1016. After many victories over the Danes, he was defeated in a bloody battle at Assandun (Ashington) in Essex by Canute, with whom he was forced to divide his kingdom, provision being made, it is said, that the survivor should be sole king. He retained Wessex, Essex, East Anglia, and London, while Canute received Northumberland and Mercia. His death, which was due to natural causes, probably, has been attributed by later tradition to poison administered by Edric Streona, his brother-in-law, at the instance of Canute. After his death Canute took possession of the whole kingdom. (Ref: THE NEW CENTURY CYCLOPEDIA OF NAMES, Vol. I, p. 1400.)

MALCOLM III

Malcolm III (of Scotland, also Malcolm III MacDuncan; called Canmore).

Died near Alnwick, Northumberland, Nov. 13, 1093. King of Scotland (1054-1093); son of Duncan I, who was slain in 1040 by Macbeth, mormaor of Moray. With the help of his uncle, Siward, Earl of Northumberland, Malcolm defeated Macbeth in 1054 and killed him in 1057. He was crowned at Scone on April 25, 1057, and in 1058, Malcolm married Margaret (second wife) sister of Edgar Atheling, through whose efforts the Roman Catholic

ritual was introduced into Scotland. In 1070 he supported the cause of his brother-in-law and invaded Northumberland, but was defeated and obliged to do homage to William I (William the Conqueror) at Abernathy in 1072. He continued his depredations in Northumbria and was forced by William II, who invaded Scotland, to do homage in 1091. He was defeated and slain by Morel of Bamborough near the Alne, at a place which afterward received the name of Malcolm's Cross. Shakespeare introduces him in Macbeth. His sons, Duncan II, Edgar, Alexander I, and David I, all were Kings of Scotland; his daughter, Matilda, became the queen of Henry I of England.

Malcolm's second wife, Margaret, died a few days after her husband's death, and was canonized afterwards, by the Roman Catholic Church, because she was largely responsible for the ecclesiastical reform effected in Scotland by her husband. Thus, she was remembered as Saint Margaret. (Ref: THE ENCYCLOPEDIA AMERICANA, p. 166, Vol. 18.)

SAINT MARGARET

Saint Margaret, (c. 1045-1093), queen of Malcolm III, Canmore King of Scotland, was the daughter of the English prince, Edward, son of Edmund Ironside, and sister of Edgar Aetheling. In 1067, the widow and children of Edward fled from Northumberland and sought the protection of the Scottish King. The marriage of Malcolm and Margaret was followed by several invasions of Northumberland by the Scottish King, probably in support of the

claims of his brother-in-law, Edgar. Margaret died on November 17, 1093, four days after her husband and her eldest son, Edward, who were slain in the invasion of Northumberland.

Margaret rebuilt the monastery of Iona, and was canonized in 1251, by the Roman Catholic Church, on account of her benefactions to the church. (Ref: ENCYCLOPEDIA BRITANNICA, page 875, Vol. 14.)

JAMES MADISON FUTRELL, eldest son of L. S. Futrell and wife Charity (Futrell) Futrell, was born on October 31, 1856, in Trigg County, Kentucky. James Madison Futrell attended Trigg County schools and became a school teacher on July 5, 1886. On June 21, 1877, James Madison Futrell married Miss Cynthia Susan Green, daughter of William L. Green and wife Eudora Marshall Green. Cynthia was born on March 4, 1859, in Stewart County, Tennessee. (An account of the Green Family on preceding pages.) James Madison and Cynthia, when young, united with the Pleasant Hill Baptist Church, of Trigg County.

James Madison Futrell and wife Cynthia Futrell were blessed with ten children, to wit:

- 1: Edgar Futrell, born July 22, 1878, died December 11, 1878, and was buried in the Ricks Futrell Cemetery.
- 2: Walter Futrell, born August 28, 1879. Married first Mattie Dixon and second to Donnie Murphy.
- 3: Seldon Futrell, born March 3, 1881, died October 16, 1881, buried in the Ricks Futrell Cemetery.

WOMAN 91, DIES AT HOME IN CITY

Funeral Services to be Saturday Afternoon.

Mrs. Cynthia (Green) Futrell, 91, widow of J. M. Futrell, died Thursday afternoon at 3 o'clock, at the home of her daughter, Mrs. C. A. Bailey, at 210 Elm Street, from complications incident to her advanced years. She had been an invalid for several years.

Mrs. Futrell was born March 4, 1859, in Stewart County, Tennessee. She was the daughter of William L. and Eudora (Marshall) Green. The family moved to Trigg County when she was 17, and she married J. M. Futrell in 1877. He died several years ago.

Four of the 10 children born to Mr. & Mrs. Futrell, survive her. In addition to the daughter at whose home she died, the survivors are, Walter Futrell, City; Mrs. J. R. Averitt, Ft. Lauderdale, Fla.; Mrs. Q. M. Peal, Eddyville; one sister, Mrs. M. E. Jones, Cadiz; 18 grandchildren, and 29 great-grandchildren and 10 great-great-grandchildren.

At the age of 18, Mrs. Futrell united with the Pleasant Hill Baptist Church. She was a fine Christian woman, and leaves a wide circle of friends in addition to the family to mourn her passing.

Funeral services will be conducted Saturday afternoon at 2 o'clock at the Keightley Funeral Home, South Main Street, by the Rev. L. L. Spurlin, a Baptist minister. Burial will follow at Riverside Cemetery.

ON JUNE 21, 1877, a small but impressive wedding between Mr. James Madison Futrell, son of L. S. and Charity Futrell and southern bell, Miss Cynthia Susan Green, was held at the home of the bride's parents, Mr. and Mrs. William Green, of Trigg County. The wedding was solemnized by Reverend A. T. Bussell, pastor of the Pleasant Hill Baptist Church of the Laura Furnace Community. The wedding was in the presence of Mr. J. P. Kilgore and Miss Ellen Futrell, cousin of Mr. Futrell. (Copied from Old Futrell Family Bible, in possession of Mrs. Viola (Futrell) Bailey.)

They were married before noon on the 21st of June and a reception of great size was held at the home of the groom's parents.

June 4, 1913

Record best remembered by W. L. Green, my grandfather, soldier in the Confederate Army. Age when he enlisted, 26 years. Enlisted at beginning of war and served the full four years. He was wounded at Franklin, Tennessee. General Commander Bragg, first, Hood, second, Eighth (8th) Arkansas regiment. Battles fought best remembered: Guysgap, Virginia; Missionary Ridge, Tennessee; Lookout Mt., Tennessee, November 23-25, 1863; Kenesaw Mt., Georgia, July 27, 1864; Corinth, Mississippi; Shiloh, Tennessee, April 6-7, 1862; Rome Georgia; Atlanta, Georgia; Newland, Georgia; Charleston, South Carolina; 1863. Was taken a prisoner at Franklin after wounded and taken to Nashville, Tennessee. Then taken to a place in Ohio. Then to a Hospital (Lookout) in Maryland, and there discharged after about 2 years. At this time there were 22,000 prisoners at this place. Returned home June 7, 1867.

COLLIN GREEN, was born in Tennessee, circa 1800. His parentage is unknown by the author. Collin Green lived at Indian Mound, Tenn. Collin Green married Winnie Hogan, on March 9, 1839, in Stewart County, Tenn. The license was issued on January 1, 1839. The wedding was solemnized by John A. Jones, M.G. Collin Green died circa 1847, at Indian Mound, Tennessee, and he was buried in Stewart Co., Tenn. About the year 1858, Winnie Hogan Green widow of Collin Green, migrated to Trigg County, Kentucky. Collin Green and his wife Winnie HOGAN Green had five children to wit:

1. William L. Green, born in Henry Co., Tenn. on August 22, 1835. William L. Green married Eudora Marshall about 1857 in Stewart Co., Tenn.
2. Samuel Green, a soldier in the Union Army during the Civil War married Mary Futrell daughter of Perry Futrell.
3. Bily Green married Grace Mertz in Trigg Co., Ky.
4. John Green, enlisted in the Confederate Army at the age of fifteen. His mother tried desperately to have him sent home due to his young age but he would not return and was killed at the Battle of Nashville and is buried in the National Memorial Cemetery, in Nashville, Tenn.
5. James Green, married Mary Tidwell in Trigg Co., Ky. They had three children: Sherman Green, Sameul Green, and Della Green.

Winnie Hogan Green died circa 1879, in Trigg County, Ky., and her body was lain to rest in the Dixon Cemetery, in Trigg Co.

(Note: The above information was received from the great-granddaughter of Collin Green, Mrs. Fredonia Futrell Peal of New Eddyville, Ky. in 1961.)

WILLIAM L. GREEN, eldest son of Collin Green and Winnie Hogan Green, was born on August 22, 1835, in Henry County, Tenn. William L. Green married Eudora Marshall, daughter of John Marshall and Martha Biggs Marshall, circa 1857 in Stewart Co., Tenn. Eudora Marshall Green was born on February 24, 1838, in Stewart Co., Tenn. Eudora's mother Martha (Biggs) Marshall Hogan was traditionally related to Robert E. Lee. Martha died in Stewart Co., Tenn. in 1877 at the age of 99. John Marshall and Martha (Biggs) Marshall had three children: Matthew, born in 1832; Susan, born in 1835; and Eudora, born in 1838. Martha Biggs Marshall secondly married Edward Hogan on May 26, 1842, in Stewart Co., Tenn. The marriage was performed by James Chambers, J.P. They had one child, Martha born in 1849, in Stewart Co., Tenn. Edward Hogan was born in 1801, in Tenn. Martha Hogan was buried at Lick Creek, near Taylor's Chapel in Stewart County, Tenn. (Mrs. Tish Jones, daughter of William L. Green gave the above data in 1961.) William L. Green emigrated to Laura Furnace in Trigg Co., KY., about 1875. He served in Co. H, 8th Arkansas Infantry, C.S.A. during the Civil War. He was wounded at Franklin Tennessee in 1864 and was taken prisoner and sent to Camp Chase, Ohio and then to a hospital called Lookout, Maryland. He was held prisoner for

two years, returning home on June 7, 1867. William L. Green and Eudora Marshall Green had five children:

1. Cynthia Susan Green born in Stewart Co., Tenn. on March 4, 1859. Cynthia married James M. Futrell on June 21, 1877 in Trigg Co., Ky. (See James M. Futrell biography.)
2. Matthew Green married Mary Barrow.
3. Sarah Green married Matthew Compton.
4. John James Green was born in 1874 and married Mary Ann Downs. John James Green died in 1945.
5. Letisha Green married Evan Jones.

Eudora Marshall Green, wife of William L. Green, died on February 15, 1916 in Trigg County, Ky. The body was lain to rest in the Ricks Futrell Cemetery on Feb. 16, 1916. William L. Green died on July 26, 1927 in Trigg Co., Ky. and was buried in the Ricks Futrell Cemetery on July 27, 1927.

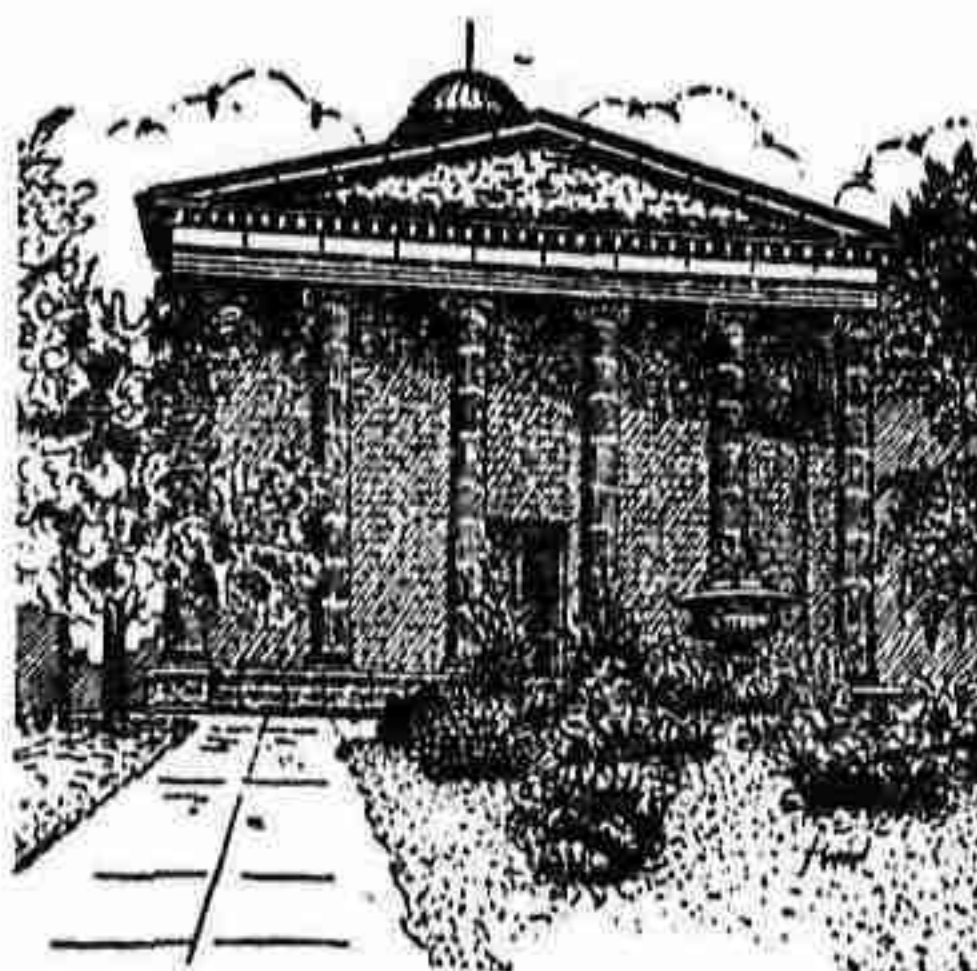

Ira Futrell, the son of James Madison Futrell and Cynthia Green Futrell, was born in Trigg County, Kentucky on September 15, 1882. He was educated in the public schools of Trigg County and married Talmadge Bland, the daughter of Alexander Bland and Lenora Cohen Bland. Talmadge Bland Futrell was born on July 12, 1883 in Trigg Co., Ky. Her parents were natives of Lyon County, Kentucky where they were married. Ira and Talmadge were married in 1903 in Trigg County, Kentucky. The family moved to Hopkinsville, Christian County, Kentucky in 1917. Ira Futrell died on April 25, 1949 in Christian Co., Ky. and was buried in Riverside Cemetery, Hopkinsville, Ky. Talmadge Bland Futrell resided in Hopkinsville in 1964.

Ira and Talmadge Bland Futrell had six children:

1. Henry Lawrence Futrell, born March 13, 1904, in Trigg County, Ky. Married Bernice Banton of Allensville, Ky. on December 24, 1932. They have one son, the author, born April 3, 1943, in Clark Co., Indiana.
2. Thomas Futrell, born July 21, 1906, married Stella Hayes on August 28, 1925. One child: Joe Thomas Futrell. Thomas Futrell died in Vanderburg Co., Ind., on Dec. 29, 1958.

The family moved to Hopkinsville, Ky., in 1917 where he was educated in the public schools. He lived in Detroit, Evansville, and other large cities until he moved back to Hopkinsville in 1930. He married Bernice Irene Banton of Allensville, Todd Co., Ky. on December 24, 1932 in Hopkinsville, Ky. Bernice was the daughter of William D. Banton and Mary Lofland Banton. William D. Banton was born on October 2, 1872 in Logan Co., Ky. the son of James Polk Banton (1846-1924) and Maranda Dorris Banton. Maranda Dorris was born in 1854 and died in 1930. James Polk Banton served in the Confederate Army during the Civil War and a bronze U.S. Government marker marks his grave which is in Keysburg, Logan Co., Kentucky. The marker reads: James Polk Banton; Virginia; Private; Co. H. 2 Regiment Virginia Cavalry; C.S.A; November 6, 1844 to Feb. 11, 1924. James Polk Banton was the son of William Banton (1815 to 1894) and Sarah Abbett Banton (1820 to 1899). William and wife are buried in Logan Co., Ky. They with their children came to Logan County, Ky., in 1870 from Virginia. Maranda Dorris Banton was the daughter of Neal Dorris and wife Lucy Aikens Dorris who were natives of Logan Co., Ky.

William D. Banton, father of Mrs. Henry Futrell, died in Logan County, Kentucky on October 1, 1958 and was buried in Belmont Cemetery, Allensville, Ky. Mary Lofland Banton, his wife died March 29, 1960 in Christian County, Ky., and was buried in Belmont Cemetery, Allensville, Ky.

For the ancestry of Mary Lofland Banton, daughter of H.H. Lofland and Drusillia Gullett Lofland and granddaughter of Horatio T. Lofland and Elizabeth Phelps Lofland see The Lofland Family, by Jewell Lofland Crow , copyright 1955. A copy of this book is deposited in the Library of Congress in Washington, D.C.

Henry and Bernice Futrell moved to Louisville, Kentucky in 1940 where he was associated with DuPont and Company until they moved back to Hopkinsville in 1946. One son, Roger Henry Lofland Futrell was born during this period of time while they were living in Clark, Co., Indiana. He was born on April 3, 1943 and graduated from Hopkinsville High School in 1961.

Henry Lawrence Futrell died after a brief illness on February 22, 1963 in Jennie Stuart Hospital, Hopkinsville, Kentucky. The funeral was held at the Fuqua Funeral Home Hopkinsville, on Monday, Feb. 25, 1963 with the Rev. Richard E. Humke, Rector of Grace Episcopal Church officiating. Burial followed at Belmont Cemetery, Allensville, Todd Co., Ky. Mrs. Bernice Banton Futrell was born in Todd Co, Ky. on May 27, 1908 and resides at Madisonville Road, Hopkinsville, Ky.

Roger Futrell, presently a student at Austin Peay College,

Clarksville, Tennessee resides at Madisonville, Road,
Hopkinsville, Kentucky.

ADDENDA: Alexander Bland, father of Talmadge Bland Futrell was born in 1850 and died in October 1895. His wife Lenora Cohen Bland was born July 4, 1853 and died in April, 1889. Alexander and Lenora Cohen were married on July 18, 1871 in Lyon Co., Kentucky. Alexander Bland was the son of Joshua Bland (circa 1820 to post 1878) and Mary Ann Scott Bland (circa 1825 to circa 1905). In our files of Confederate pensions, we have the pension application of James Banton, number 31, and also the application for Widow's Pension of Maranda M. (Dorrian) Banton, number 4296.

James Banton applied for pension April 26, 1912, and at that time was living near Keysburg, Logan Co., Ky. He enlisted as a private in Company H, 2nd Virginia Cavalry, September 25, 1863, and was with Gen. Lee when he surrendered in 1865. James was born in Appomattox Co., Virginia, Nov. 6, 1844 and had lived in Kentucky since 1873.

James died February 11, 1924. A copy of his death certificate says that his father was William Banton and his mother Sarah Abbott. He married Maranda Dorris, December 16, 1871 in Robertson County, Tennessee. Their marriage is recorded in Robertson county marriage book 2, page 225. Maranda was born in 1854 in Logan County, Kentucky.


