HINSON, Aaron in Dobbs County in 1790, Lenoir 1810 but gone in 1820 leaving behind Martin, Hardy, Needham, Joseph, Jesse, and James. Martin, Needham, Jesse, James and William came to Pike and Barbour Counties, Alabama between 1830 and 1850. Needham's wife was Loney Ann. WHO WAS HIS FATHER?

ELMORE, John came from Wayne County, N. C. Husband of Heddie Ann Hinson the daughter of Needham and Loney Ann Hinson.

HATCHEL - Morris Hatchel lived in Wake County between 1779 and 1785, then apparently settled in Wayne County where he is listed as head of household, 1790 census. He wrote his will in Darlington County, S. C. in 1797 and died there about 1804. Need information on his Virginia ancestors and Carolina descendants.

GARDNER: I

was born 18 June 1909 in Aurora, Beaufort County, N. C., daughter of Henry Hertford Gardner and Effie Penelope Hardy. My paternal grandfather was Henry Clay Gardner, born in Wayne County, 2 March 1842 son of Tilman Gardner and Nancy Thompson. There is a tradition in our family that Henry Clay Gardner walked to Texas and back before he was 21, with his father. Henry Clay Gardner enlisted in the Confederate Army from Texas. He was cited for helping Confederate forces find their way across one of the east Texas rivers, and was wounded in some of the fighting in Baltimore. After the war, he returned to North Carolina and married my grandmother, Mary Olivia Thompson, daughter of Tarlton Thompson and Susan Elizabeth Bryan. What happened to his father, Tilman Gardner? Who was Tilman Gardner's father? One source gave his name as "Theophilus". I found two Theophilus Gardners in Wayne County but nothing to prove that Tilman was the son. Would appreciate and help.

Page 95: Alice Hamilton, Exx of Ferdinand Hamilton vs James Shepperd, Admr. - Oliver Smith. A deed proved to have been executed by Smith to Ferdinand Hamilton "all his right in land warrant transfered to Nancy Shepperd - Smith married Shepperd.

Page 102: Joshua Ammons and Brother John Ammons - mention Robert G. Green and Robert Ammons.

Page 110: John Davis, Admr. Barnaby Bulls vs Jacob Brooks 3 slaves - that his daughter intermarried with Willis Watson in month of June 1807 - Bulls had bought negroes at John N. Smiths sale (Betsy wife of Watson) - Barnaby Bulls died intestate leaving Watson and his daughter surviving him. Watson died and one Jernigan then married widow Watson

Page 430: State vs Joseph Martin etal destroying house of Lucy Showell - charged Joseph Martin, Thomas Durden, Joel Newson, Isaac Newson.

Page 58: Moses Langston vs Richard McKinnie - Risdon Nicholson conveyed lands to Jacob Langston on 8 Aug 1780, that Jacob Langston devised same to plaintiff on 25 Dec 1784 and shortly afterwards died. That a Grant from State issued to Risdon Nicholson on 10 April 1792, survey 10 June 1782. That Risdon Nicholson conveyed same to Thomas Daughtry on 24 Dec 1783, who conveyed same to Fredick Herring on 7 Jan 1784 that Frederick Herring by his will, empowerd his excs. to sell and on 20 Nov 1805, he being dead, they sold land to defendant. Jury found that Frederick Herring had possession of lands for seven years from 4 June 1784.

Page 186: Elisha Pipkin died sometime subsequent to 21 Dec 1784 and previous to 1 Jan 1795 intestate. Leaving sons Joseph, Elisha, Charles and James and that James died after the year 1794 but previously to 1808 intestate and without issue leaving Joseph, Elisha and Charles his brothers of the whole blood and Mille and Ruth Pipkin his sisters of the whole blood and leaving John Coor, a half brother on the mothers side.

Page 204: William Hollowell vs George Kornegay
Richard Martin - will in 1786 - give my son Richard my dwelling plantation only my wife to live on $\frac{1}{2}$ during her widowhood and no longer - if my son die without heir - equally divided between own sisters. The wife died, and then Richard died in 1843 without issue. The defendant claims under conveyances in fee made by Richard the son in 1798 - the testator left several daughters and they all died before their father Richard except Sarah Flowers, who is the lessor of the plaintiff - the testator appointed 2 Execs. - who died before 1843 - Admr. sold premises in fee to William Hollowell.
