MINUTES OF MARCH MEETING

The regular meeting of the Old Dobbs County Genealogical Society was held March 8, 1987 at 2:00pm in the Auditorium of the Wayne County Public Library. Second Vice-President Frances Andrews presided in the absence of President Elliott Futrell.

The minutes were approved as read and it was announced that we had 14 new members.

The Heritage Book balance is approximately \$4000. Mary Spiron is to investigate the cost of publishing an extra amount of Old Dobbs Co. Record books.

A motion was made and passed to change the time of our meetings to 3pm beginning in April.

Doris Smith advised she would help but could not assume the entire responsibility for the cemetery project. She told us that Donna Flowers had sent material to be used for abandoned and unlisted cemeteries etc. Also geological and/or soil survey maps to mark them on. Doris said that she would hold this material. Mary Spiron suggested that this project might be persued as a joint project with the UDC.

Frances Andrews read us information on the National Genealogical Society's Annual National Conference to be held in Raleigh from May 13 to May 16. The registration fee is \$75. For more information contact Frances or June Beason.

The program this month was on the Wayne County Museum which is being handled by the Wayne County Historical Society. Mrs. Ethel Twiford, chairperson of the Theme and Management Policy Committee and Mrs. Mary Johnston, chairperson of the Board of Directors for the Museum were on hand to tell us about the Historical Society and Museum and to answer questions. They gave a short history of the Society and told how they began collecting artifacts but had no place to house them. At different times the artifacts were housed in space available in the Court House, Old Telephone Office and the County Poor House. Also much of it had to be kept by individual members and could not be displayed. In 1960 Joy Jordan helped to catalogue the items. When the Woman's Club offered their building it was like an answer to a prayer. They went on to tell how the work of renovating the building is coming and of the different activities they have had to raise money for the renovation. Also, they told of what yet needs to be done before the Museum is fully operational.

The meeting was adjourned at 3:15pm.
