President Mary Spiron said that she had received a letter from the Genealogical Department of the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints giving instructions on how non-members may place their records with the Genealogical Society of the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints.

The meeting was adjourned at 4:30 pm.

Charlotte R. Carrere has compiled the 1800 Wayne County Census and thanks to her generosity, it will be printed in the newsletters this quarter.

We appreciate the material that each of our members contribute to the newsletter and we are taking steps to have the newsletter copyrighted in order to protect the material donated by individuals that may have plans to publish in the future. The society will grant contributing authors the privilege of using their own material in any subsequent publication.

Cost of Vital Statistic certificates in NC will raise to \$5.00 as of 1 October both in the Office of Vital Statistics and local courthouses.

The Forsyth County Genealogical Society in Winston-Salem will present "German Workshop 2" on 20 and 21 September 1985.
