## MINUTES OF MAY MEETING

The regular monthly meeting of the Old Dobbs County Genealogical Society held on Sunday, May 11, 1986 at the Wayne County Public Library with 15 members present and 1 guest was called to order at 3:00pm by President Mary Spiron.

It was announced that if you wished to have your pedigree chart published it should be turned into June Beason by May 25.

It was also announced that there were 5 maps of Old Dobbs County and 5 Gilmore maps for sale at the price of \$1 each.

Mary told us that the NC Board of Medical Examiners in Raleigh has records from 1859. They can be seen Mon-Fri from 9-5 at their building.

Elliott Futrell told us that he had extra booklets from last month's speaker on Methodist Churches in Wayne County if anyone wanted any.

The minutes of the last meeting were approved as written. Yvonne Hatch gave the treasurer's report.

Robbie Moye suggested that we consider changing the time and/or day of our meeting as Sunday is very inconvenient for some. Some ideas were tossed around and it was decided to think about it until the next meeting.

Dear Members:

We extend a welcome to our new members Jerome D. Tew, Donald H. Gurley and Mrs. Carolyn Schell.

The Board expresses their appreciation to Fannie Gardner Bryson for her donation toward the marriage applications.

The past year has moved at a rapid pace. In our first Board meeting we set our goals for the year. With the cooperation of the membership we have reached every goal. I feel that it is fitting at this time to review our accomplishments for the year.

1. We returned the duplicating machine to Caroline Office Supply and settled that account.
2. We purchased a file cabinet in which to keep our material.
3. We started and have maintained a 10 page newsletter each month.
4. We recognized with a Certificate all the past Presidents of the society and members that had turned in over 100 gravestone inscriptions.
5. We requested and were granted reinstatement in the Wayne County Historical Association, Inc.
6. We collected bound and donated to the library a volume of all the past newsletters. We also collected and bound a volume of miscellaneous material that had been printed by the society and gave that to the library.
7. We published our Marriage Records of Wayne and Johnston Counties and donated a copy of that to the library.
8. We settled our account at the Court House for the marriage applications from 1876 to 1882. These have been bound in four volumes to be used by the members for research.
9. I have penned a certificate suitable for hanging listing our Charter members. A copy will be given to each of our Charter Members.
10. We have our workshop scheduled with Everton for October 15th. Wayne County Community College will co-sponsor the workshop with us. We are very happy to have their support. See back page for application.
11. Our most recent achievement is the publication of our collection of Ancestral Charts, Bible Records, Cemetery Records, Census, Election Records, Military Records, Information about Waynesborough, Tax Records and Wills. In our last newsletter I stated that it would cost about \$18.00 but much to my surprise material kept coming in and our book grew and grew. We have 300 pages of excellent research material thanks to the cooperation of our members. You will see our order form on page nine.

I have enjoyed the opportunity of working with each of you during the past year.
