Dear Members and other Friends:



PRESERVING YOUR DOCUMENTS

If you are one of those persons who like to collect clippings of genea-interest, or of any other interest, then you are probably someone who would be interested in knowing how to preserve those clippings which deteriorate rather quickly because of high acidity in the paper on which they are printed. This causes the paper to turn brittle and yellow.

Acidity will migrate from one paper to another, therefore, it is recommended that you not store the clippings in a book, diary or with other valuable items. It is also recommended that you do not use a scrapbook as the pages are of acidic paper. Even a piece of tape or a metal clip can ruin your documents over a period of time. Some black inserts in plastic report holders contain acid that will "eat up" your weddings, obituaries and other important clippings.

There is a pamphlet that you can order from the Georgia Department of Archives and History, 330 Capitol Ave., Atlanta, Georgia 30300. Its title is "Techniques Recommended in Restoring and Preserving of Books, Manuscripts and Documents". It is only a basic guide and it costs \$3 but is worth the price.

If you would like to try your hand at preserving your clippings with a home concocted solution try this: Mix two teaspoons magnesium carbonate and one quart of club soda in a large plastic, rectangular pan that will hold paper the size of a standard sheet of

typing paper but will also hold your smaller clippings. Sandwich your document or clipping between sheets of pellow (a material sold in fabric stores.) Soak for 30 minutes in the solution, then lay document still in the pellow, flat on a table and blot out excess liquid with blotting paper. Allow to dry overnight on more blotting paper. When you are sure papers are dry, store in flat, well-sealed plastic bags.

There is an acid-free paper available from the Hollinger Corporation, P. O. Box 6185, Arlington, VA 22206. If you write them, you might also inquire if they have an archivist pen which is used to test the acidity of paper. The pen contains bromocresol green which measures pH values. If a mark from a pen turns yellow the level of acidity is high; if the mark turns green the paper on which it is written is acceptable, but a blue mark is the best. It indicates that the paper is acid-free.

For pasting clippings onto acid-free paper, there is an acid-free glue called Stickflat Glue that is available from G and W Associates, 3067 Lemay Ave., Salt Lake City, UT 84119.

On the other hand, if you only wish to preserve your clippings for a few months in a neat and clean way, an inexpensive photo album with the magnetic sheets of plastic is the best way to keep them in order and your hands free of ink.



A clue for the Dobbs Co NC Mazingo family:

Booth, Elizabeth - 27 Oct 1708 - 26 Jan 1708.

One-half household goods, one flock bed and furnishings to daughter Ann Grimstead (sic) and her husband Thomas, 5 head of cattle and hogs; their sons William, one mare, and Thomas Grimestead (sic), one mare, 1 cow and calf; Joan Stephens; son-in-law Edward Mazingo, 500 lbs. tobacco to buy nails; and 5 head of cattle; grandchildren: Sarah, John Mazingo, bed, furniture, pewter, 1 mare and 1 heifer. Page 44 - Wills of Westmoreland Co Va 1654-1800 by Augusta Fothergill.

Note: Westmoreland Co is the same county that George Washington's parents lived 'Wakefield' and the Lee family at 'Stratford' on the Potomac River and near the Chesapeake Bay. This is the same county that I located my Hardy/Odyer family.

Note: I remember meeting a guy doing research on the Mazingo Family a while back - but I do not have his name or address. Do you think you might be able to locate him. I remember he told me he had a Booth Mazingo and a Pierce Mazingo in his collection - both these surnames are in Westmoreland Co Va. (Surnames as given names are usually a clue)

The above John Mazingo is found in the Granville Grants - so he is in our area.

Under the head "Remarks" opposite the name of the person unable to do Military duty, will be written the cause of such inability.

NOTE:--These Confederate records were all found in a private collection at the North Carolina Archives in Raleigh, N.C. In NORTH CAROLINA TROOPS: 1861-1865 it states: No company muster rolls were found for November, 1862-August, 1864, or for the period after February, 1865 (for the 27th Regiment). It also contains the following information:

Company "A": This Company, known as the "Goldsboro Rifles," was raised in Wayne County and enlisted at Fort Macon in Carteret County on April 15, 1861. it was mustered into service on June 13, 1861, and was later assigned to the 27th Regiment as Company A. After joining the regiment the company functioned as a part of the regiment, and its history for the war period is reported as a part of the regimental history.

None of the names on the Muster Rolls from the private collection appear in NORTH Carolina troops; 1861-1865, Volume VIII, which contains information on the 27th Regiment.

GUIDE TO PRIVATE MANUSCRIPT COLLECTIONS IN THE NORTH CAROLINA STATE ARCHIVES gives this information concerning the George W. Collier Papers, 1861-1865, 30 items: Papers of Collier, Wayne Co. militia colonel and district tax collector during Civil War, including commission; muster rolls (27th Regt. N.C. Militia), 1862; account of provisions purchased; rations issued to soldiers families in Dudley District (Wayne Co.) giving wife's name and number of children (1864); tax receipts and reports to Richmond; and a few letters about provisions.

I feel certain that John Taylor or some of the other young men at the N.C. Archives would be able to better understand this than I am. John is very knowledgeable on this subject and very willing to help others.

The Obituary of Sister Nancy (Best) Wooten

The subject of this obituary died 4 July 1871, her age was sixty nine years, She joined the Church at Mewborn's Meeting House Sept (2nd. Sunday) 1845, where her membership remained until her death in full fellowship. (page 66) She died in the triumph of faith, leaving several children and grandchildren to mourn their loss, but in hope their loss is her eternal gain. (page 67) (turn to page 79) Sister Wooten was born Sept., Saturday, 22nd, 1792, her maiden name was Best. Daughter of Benjamin (Jr) and Mary Best, whose maiden name was Hardy. Daughter of Lemuel (Jr) and Mary Hardy, whose maiden name was Sutton. These (last) two were members of The Methodist Church. See the Obituary of George Mewborn on page 48. She was married to Thomas Wooten, the son of John Wooten (Jr), by whom she had 18 children. (12 lived - 6 died) Her husband was taken from her Sept. 4, 1844. She was received a member of the Church at Mewborn's M. (Meeting) H. (House) Sept. 1845. She remained a widow to the time of her death, which took place July 4, 1871. At the time of her death, her family numbered 66. It may well be said that a mother in Israel is gone. (John Wooten Jr m. Sarah Hewes - I.E.M.)
