Due to the increased request for back issues of the Dobbs Trails our Treasurer and I got together several weeks ago to decide how to best handle this request. After computing the cost of reproducing the booklet, plus mailing cost, we are pleased to announce that we now have copies of the booklet for sale. Because the material in the booklet is previously unpublished material we are applying for a copy right on the booklet. It is hole punched for a three ring binder and future issues of the newsletter will also be hole punched.

At the July meeting the members present voted to order ~~five~~ (5) books dealing with Virginia research for the local history room at the public library. These books are:

A Hornbook of Virginia History- this is an expanded and update (1983) version of the Hornbook. This books deals with the county formations of Va. and includes those Ill., Pa., Ky., and W. Va. counties that were at one point in time part of Va. This book sells for \$7.50 and may be ordered directly from the Va. State Library, Richmond, Va.

A Guide to Genealogical Notes and Charts in the Archives Branch, Va. State Library

This little gem of a book lists alphabetically pedigrees, genealogical notes that include bible records. Primary collections are alphabetically with an index that cross references the main collections. Cost is \$5.00 same order address.

Parish Lines, Diocese of Souther Virginia, this book is a must for someone who is trying to determine where a certain parish was located in the early days of Va. This book also sells for \$5.00 same ordering address. For your benefit you may need to know that they also have the Parish lines, Diocese of Southwestern Virginia and Parish lines, Diocese of Virginia, cost of these are \$5 each same ordering address. Virginia Land Office Inventory, an excellent guide to the Land Office records and a real bargain for \$2.00 same ordering address.

English Wills: Probate Records in England and Wales: title is misleading as it also discusses Scottish and Irish wills. It is important to remember that many of the early Va. residents were named in wills filed in the mother company. Cost of this book is \$5.00 same ordering address.

Carolyn Griffin, our Local History Librarian, has a "want" list and at the top of the list is the book by Murtie June Clark, Colonial Soldiers of the South 1732-1774. This 1,250 page work identifies approximately 55,000 soldiers by name, rank, date, militia company, and district. Other sources used in the book are the size rolls these give name, age, size (i.e. height), country of birth, occupation, and date and

place of enlistment. Carolyn's problem is that this book sells for \$50 and just isn't in her budget.

This is a good time to remind our members that a donation to the Society Book Fund is a much more lasting memorial of family and friends. Such donations are also tax deductible. Should you wish to do this please send directly to our treasurer and mark you check Book Fund.

Dr. Donald R. Lennon, Director of the East Carolina University Manuscript Collection, was our guest speaker at the July meeting. In addition to an interesting slide presentation dealing with the steps take in collection, preservation of material given or solicated to the collection. The University Collection aims at private material and not county records that one would expect to be in the Archives. If, you have family material that you would like to donate to the collection they would be most happy to hear from you.

A number of people have written or called to say that they had gotten two page 14's and were missing page 16. Since this was on the Johnson County marriage bonds we are re-running that page in this issue. We regret any inconvienece this may have caused any of you.

We are continuing the marriage bonds in this issue and when we have finished with them we plan on running the prel790 Craven County marriage bonds.

I have at long last found the land division book of Wayne County. As many of you know the Clerk of Court for many years handled not only those affairs that we associate with the office today but also had charge of the land records. When the serarate office was established the Clerk at that time apparently felt that since land divisions were ordered by the court that these records should remain in his office. The Clerk also has the Dower book. I plan on abstracting material from these books this winter.

Congradulations are in order for our member, Lynn Gorgas on the birth of her son William Christopher on 30 of August.

N. C. Reports: Murphey's Law & Equity Vol 111 # 7

p. 95 Alice Hamilton, Ex'x of Ferdinand Hamilton va. James Shepperd, Adm'r of Oliver Smith. A deed proved to have been executed by Smith to Ferdinand Hamilton "All his right in land warrant transfered to Nancy Shepperd" -Smith married Shepperd.

p. 102 Joshua Ammons & Brother John Ammons - mentions Robert G. Green & Robert Ammons

p. 110 John Davis, Adm'r Barnaby Bulls va Jacob Brooks 3 slaves- that his daughter intermarried with Willis Watson in Month of June 1807-Bulls had bought Negroes at John N. Smiths sale (Betsey wife of Watson)-Barnaby Bulls died intestate leaving Watson & his daughter surviving him-Watson died and one Jernigan then married widow Watson.

p. 430 State vs Joseph Martin et. al. -destroying house of Lucy Showell-charged Joseph Martin, Thomas Durden, Joel Newson, Isaac Newson.

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p. 58 Moses Langston vs. Richard McKinnie - Risdon Nicholson conveyed lands to Jacob Langston on 8 Aug 1780, that Jacob Langston devised same to Plaintiff on 25 Dec 1784 & shortly afterwards died. That a grant from state issued to Risdon Nicholson on 1- Apr 1792, survey 10 June 1782. That Risdon Nicholson conveyed same to Thomas Daughtry on 24 Dec 1783, who conveyed same to Frederick Herring on 7 Jan 1784 that Frederick Herring by his will, empowered his Exc's to sell & on 20 Nov 1805, he being dead, they sold land to defendant. Jury found that Frederick Herring had possession of lands for seven years from 4 June 1784.

p. 186 Elisha Pipkin died sometime subsequent to 21 Dec 1784 & previous to 1 Jan 1795 intestate, leaving sons Joesph, Elisha, Charles & James & that James died after the year 1794 but previously to 1808 intestate & without issue - leaving Joseph, Elisha, & Charles his brothers of the whole blood & Mille & Ruth Piplin his sisters of the whole blood & leaving John Coor, a half brother on the mothers side.

State vs. John Barfield

Prisoner was indicted in Sampson Co. for the murder of Alfred Flowers-trial was removed to Cumberland - removed to Johnston County----Samuel Flowers, father of deceased--Robert Flowers, wits-son of dec'd was 15 or 16 at time of homicide--- John Flowers son of dec'd a little younger---mention of wife & John Barfield being kin through marriage-she called him "Uncle Jack"

p. 204 William Hollowell vs. George Kornegay

Richard Martin-will in 1786-give my son Richard my dwelling plantation-only my wife

to live on ½ during her widowhood & no longer-if my son dies without heir equally divided between own sister.

The wife died & then Richard died in 1843 without issue the defendant claims under conveyances in fee made by Richard the son in 1798-the testator left several daughters & they all died before their father Richard except Sarah Flowers, who is the lessor of the plaintiff-the testator appointed 2 exec's-who died before 1843-Adm'r sold premises in fee to William Hollowell.

This old cemetery is located off Wayne Memorial Drive across from Wayne Memorial Hospital and on the Edwin Cox Farm and known as the Bryant Thompson Cemetery. Society member, Mary Spiron has corrected the omissions in the cemetery book. In the book it is on page 563 if you own a copy please make the corrections. Those item marked with an * are corrected items, ones marked with an + are black graves. Those marked with an # are graves left out of the cemetery book.

DOBBS COUNTY: 1780 TAX LIST
(Present-day Greene and Lenoir Cos., N. C.)

Contributed by Mr. Charles R. Holloman

NOTE BY MR. HOLLOMAN: This tax list covered all of Dobbs County, which in 1780 included lands which later became Glasgow (now Greene) and Lenoir Counties. (Dobbs Co. abolished 1791 and re-created into Glasgow and Lenoir Counties; name of Glasgow changed in 1799 to Greene. Wayne County had been formed from Dobbs at the end of the previous year, 1779, so is not included in this 1780 list.) This 1780 list indicated a total of ten districts which I have assigned numbers from 1 through 10 - Districts No. 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, and 9 cover the Lenoir Co. area; Districts No. 6, 7, 8, and 10 cover the Greene Co. area. I have arranged the names alphabetically for each of the ten districts. There are two numbers preceding each name; the first name indicates the district, and the second number indicates the order in which the taxpayer appeared; hence, "1-12" means District No. 1, the 12th taxpayer listed. I have also noted the approximate location of each of the ten districts in reference to present-day communities in the area. The total valuation of each taxpayer's property is also given. The original of this 1780 tax list of Dobbs Co., N. C., is in the Archives (P. O. Box 1881, Raleigh, N. C. 27602), File No. L. P. 46.1
