CEMETERY PROJECT UPDATE, Elliott R. Futrell and Billy G. Herring -

Chairpersons. The Wayne County Cemetery Abstraction Committee of the Old Dobbs County Genealogical Society has met with many obstacles as it has worked to complete this project. At the time the committee began this project, there were no computer programs written specifically for cemetery abstraction. An individual at Wayne Community College was retained to write a program for the Wayne County project. The program that was written was good for compiling abstracted data. However, when attempts were made later to print out the Great Swamp and Nahunta Townships for the first book, it was discovered the specific parameters required to print the abstracted data as needed had not been built into the database design.

The committee recently purchased computer software that became available for recording cemetery projects. All the grave spaces in Great Swamp and Nahunta Townships had to be reentered into the new program. As of this month, about half of the grave spaces in Nahunta Township have been re-entered in the computer.

Work was in progress on the second book in Buck Swamp and Pikeville Township when it was called to the committee's attention that it would be very beneficial to provide navigational coordinates as an aid to identify cemetery locations in the future, especially those that may be destroyed. A GPS (Global Positioning System) navigator device was then purchased for this project. It was decided to go back to all the cemeteries in Great Swamp and Nahunta Townships to record all the V & H coordinates (Longitude and Latitude). All the V & H coordinates in Nahunta and Great Swamp Townships have now been recorded. From the very beginning it was estimated that the projected time to complete this project would be 12 to 15 years.

GOLDSBORO NEWS, Goldsboro, NC

Wednesday, August 4, 1869

DIED, In Raleigh, on the morning of the 2nd of August, Mr. LEE H. WHITAKER, brother of the Editor of this paper. [J. B. Whitaker]

Wednesday, September 1, 1869

DIED, In Wayne County, on the evening of the 30th [?] ultimo, EVIE M., infant daughter of M.K. and Ophelia Crawford. Funeral will take place from the residence this (Wednesday) morning at 10 o'clock.

DISCHARGES IN BANKRUPTCY. – The following discharges in bankruptcy were granted by the Hon. Geo. W. Brooks, Judge of the U.S. District Court at August term at Salisbury:... Wayne – Malchus K Crawford

Wednesday, September 22, 1869

Mr. Albert Day offers his residence, on William Street, for sale. It is in a pleasant part of the town, and in an excellent neighborhood. See advertisement.

BADLY HURT. – Windell Pipkin, a youth, son of W[ill]is Pipkin, Esq., of this town, was badly hurt at the Cotton Gin of Mr. E.B. Borden, on Friday last. By some means he got his knee among the saws, and before he could be extr[ac]ated his leg was lacerated in a shocking manner.

Wednesday, September 29, 1869

DEATH FROM A SINGULAR CAUSE. — A Mr. Tyner, residing in Johnston County, died last Friday, from a very singular cause. He was engaged in stacking some fodder, when he was bitten on the face, near the corner of the right eye, by some reptile or insect. Great pain immediately ensued, and a physician was sent for; but before he arrived the sufferer was insensible, and despite every remedy employed, he died within nine hours after he was bitten. Our informant states that Mr. Tyner was of opinion that the bite was from a striped lizard; but the physician thought it was inflicted by a spider. — Raleigh Sentinel.
